I recommend my Soul to Almighty God that gave it to me, and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried in a Christian like manner according to the discretion of my Friends hereafter left behind. I do troubling of worldly Estates such as it hath been please Almighty God to bless me with, I give and dispose of in manner and form as followeth Vizt. I leave these Trade of Land (one by the name of Ben Lammes land now called Hobb's Creek, and one called Witting's Creek) to be sold and the money arising therefrom to go to the use of paying my Debts.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Rebekah Parker five Pounds Sterling, English, Bob Jacob Estate to her and her heirs forever.

I leave to my beloved wife Sally Parker the use of four hundred Hhds of Powder, Hhds of Salt, & Co. during her natural life and after her Decease, I give the said negro to my Daughter Rebekah Parker to she and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto Richard Parker my Servt, Briddle and Seattle, and one hundred Pounds in Cash to him and his heirs forever.

I leave my negro whom called Ned, to be set free, and have the liberty of living on my Land during his life.

I leave all the remaining part of my Estate, Not already given away both Real, and Personal to be equally Divided between my beloved wife Sally Parker, and my Daughter Rebekah Parker, during my wife's lifetime, and after the death of wife I give all the rest property which is hertofore left to be divided between my wife and my Daughter, wholly to my Daughter Rebekah Parker, to she and her heirs forever. Also I hereby Constituted and appointed Jamish Brown (Esq.) James Clegg, & John ell Bynford my whole Executors of this my last Will & Testament, Disannulling, overruling, and Revoking any other Will or Wills hertofore made by me or in my Name setting & Confirming
