Alm I Give & bequeath unto my son Micajah Brown Two Negroes, Phadraah & Sarah and one Mare & one Cow & Furniture to him his Heir for ever
Alm I Give unto my son Brattle Brattle one Cow & Furniture to him this day
And all the rest of my estate to be equally divided between my two Sons Micajah Brown & Brattle Brattle. Also I leave unto William on my hold whole Executor of this my last Will & Testament as bearing my hand and Seal this the Eight day of November in the Year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven Hundred & Ninety

In the Name of God Amen, I Mike Walden of Northampton County State of North Carolina being of sound mind & perfect memory blessed be God for the same, do this 6th day of November in the Year of Lord 1806 do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say,

I Give & bequeath unto Sam in Law, Sarah Franklin fifty Dollars to him his Heir for ever

I leave to my loving Wife during her natural life one half of my Estate in Northampton County and I Give & bequeath unto my wife one half of

my Washable property to her this day for ever

30th I Give & bequeath unto my son William Walden son of William Walden one half of my Land in Northampton County & the other half after the death of my Wife (and one half of my Washable property to him this day for ever

Alm I Give & bequeath unto my Brother Wm Walden one half of Land in State of Virginia to him this day for ever, & I Give & bequeath unto my Brother Wm Walden Executor of this my last Will & Testament in things whereof I have Interest but my hand I give my Seal the day I Give above Will

In the Name of God Amen, I William Paison of the County of Northampton State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound sense and memory do make & publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say,

Alm I Give to Susan Paison son of my sister (Pebah Paison one Negro Man name Harry to him this day also one Hundred Dollars also one horse & choice of my Stock

Alm I Give & bequeath to Eliza both Paison daughter of my sister (Pebah Paison all my Lands Two Negroes (name Sally & Aggy, to her this day for ever. The rest of my Property I leave to her to be equally divided between Susan Paison & Eliza both Paison above mentioned & them Heir for ever

I nominate & appoint my Nephew James Paison & John Walden my Executors & I give my Seal the day I Give above Will

Wile & Wile Executors of this my last Will & Testament hereby
resolving all Wills heretofore made by me Nathaniel Parson
I have herewith set my hand & Seal this the Twenty eight day
of September 1866

Anthony & Williams's Will

In the Name of God Amen I Anthony & Williams of the County
of Northampton and State of North Carolina Being Weak of
Body but of sound and perfect Memory do make this our
last Will and Testament in Manner &
Form following (To-wit):

First I bequeath to my Father Thomas Williams five hundred

Dollars

Second I bequeath unto my Sister Margaret Williams five hundred Dollars

Third I bequeath to Littlebury Mason my slave Malachi
to him and his heirs forever

Fourth My Will and desire is that my land known by the Name
of Oakleys Plantation and Mrs. Hillybances and one Eighth
Part of the land purchased of Christopher Chatham
known by the Name of their Farm house be sold for
Cash Money here is and which is on the date one thousand
and Eight hundred and Eighty Dollars the Money to be
also all my Goods that is on hand be sold on a Credit
of Nine Months and the Cash that is on hand be

sent to Petersburg immediately and sold for Cash to pay my
Debts and the Money arising from the above mentioned
Land and going to discharge the above Legacies and in
discharging my last Debt

Then

I bequeath unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Williams all the Name
and all of my whole Estate both real & Personal as
long as she may live Single & my Son Nathaniel Williams
during to the Age of Eighteen by my Will then my desire is that
at either of those Periods that a Divisor should take Place
and that my Wife Elizabeth Williams shall draw one third
Part and my Son Nathaniel shall draw two thirds Part
at the Death of my Wife the said one third Part to
return to my Son Nathaniel the said Williams to him and his
heirs forever the my desire is that if my Son Nathaniel
the said Williams should die before he coming to the age of

Eighteen years old & My Wife shall
have the following Negroes (To-wit): Males Sally, George,
Miles, Joe, Isaac, John, Charity, Charles, Em, Buttons,
Deliver, Lucy, Amy, Abby, Sarah, Lucy, Nelson, & Maggie
also one half of all my Stock of Horses, Mules, Cattle, Hogs,
and a Sheep and all my Household Furniture and my De-
sires that I now live on bounded by the land that I
now hold it by with one half of my Plantation then
left to her and her heirs forever and if my Son Nathaniel
the said Williams should die before he coming to the age of

Eighteen years old & My Wife shall have the Balance of all my
Cash and Money and all my other Property not before
mentioned to be sold and the Money arising from
such Sale to divide & hereafter divided

Then

I give one third Part of the above mentioned Sale of the Land
and Money to my Father Thomas Williams

Then

I give one third Part of such Sale to my Sister Margaret
H. Williams and my Wife & that one third of such Sale
shall be paid out on interest by my Executors and the
interest arising thereon to be paid to my Sister Sally
every annually and if my Sister Sally long should live
