

Alles Collier's Will

In the name of God AMEN I Alles Collier of Northampton County in North Carolina being of a sound mind and memory thanks be to almighty God for the same and knowing that it is appointed for all men to die I do this 15th day of May in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety three make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows first I command my soul to almighty God keeping through the mouth of my beloved Saviour Jesus Christ that he will safely to receive it and my body to the grave to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter mentioned, and for what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bestow on Ellis me with in this life I desire of it no more & form as follows

Item first I will that my debts be paid.

Item I do leave to my wife Susannah Collier my Land and plantation until her death or marriage.

Item Give and bequeath to my Daughter Nancy Collier and her furniture which is called the said Nancy Collier

Item I do leave to my wife Susannah Collier five Negroes and their increase, Reba, Matilda, Shuby, Hardy & George until my son Jonathan Collier arrives to the age of twenty one years or my wife death or marriage with all the remainder part of my estate until his death or marriage or my son Jonathan Collier comes of age a least term of time.

Item My Will is at my wife Susannah Collier's death or marriage or when my son Jonathan Collier comes to the age of twenty one years or that term of time for all those five Negroes and their increase and all the remainder part of my estate excepting my Land to be sold and the money equally divided between my wife if not married and my six children, Nancy Collier, Gran Collier, Sam Collier, Sarah Collier, Jane Collier & Jonathan Collier or their Heirs, but if my wife marry before my son Jonathan Collier comes to the age of twenty one years old my will is for it to be equally divided between my six children just above named only, if not for her to have an equal part with them six children.

Item My will is at my wife Susannah Collier's death or marriage for my Land to be sold and the money to be equally divided between my three Sons Gran Collier, James Collier & Jonathan Collier

And Lastly I do appoint and ordain Joshua Collier, William Horner, and William Horner my whole and sole Executrix of this my

William Ricks Will

In the name of God AMEN. William Ricks of Northampton County N.C. late of North Carolina being at this time very weak in body but of sound mind and memory thank be to God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die & partake the worldly goods and both placed God to help me with a Will in the following manner and form.

Item Give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Ricks five shillings to her heirs forever

Item Give and bequeath to my Daughter Martha Ricks five shillings to her heirs forever

Item Give and bequeath to my Grand Son Ricks five shillings to him & his Heirs forever

Item Give Bequests to my Son William Ricks five shillings to him & his Heirs forever

Item Give Bequests to my Daughter Elizabeth Ricks five shillings to her & her Heirs forever

Item Give Bequests to my Son Scipio Ricks five shillings to him & his Heirs forever

Item Give Bequests to my Daughter Susannah Collier five shillings to her & her Heirs forever

Item Give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Jordan Ricks Fifty acres of land to wit beginning at a pine in Middleys old field then a South line to about two rods then up the said road to a pine then a line of marked trees to the first station being fifty acres more or less to my Grand Son and His Heirs forever

Item Give and bequeath unto my Son Davis Ricks Three Acres to wit begining Harry and Rachel also an Desk an folding table and Case of bottles and bed

and furniture and my Carpenter Tools my large Iron Hattle, one both also an hundred and twenty five acres of Land which I bought of Joseph Sewell also three head of breeding Cattle, I say to my Son David Ricks and his heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Edwin Ricks two Negroes to w^t Lucy Slavery in bed and furniture the sea both our Hattles, one pair of Cistles and a Bush, also my Coopers Tools, and those makers Tools, three head of breeding cattle also one hundred and fifty acres of land, being the land which I surveyed last adjoining Abraham Johnsons land and my old house also ninety acres of land contained by estimation to be the same more or less formerly called Marmande who I say to my Son Edwin Ricks and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Sons David and Edwin Ricks my Watch case and Crop cut case to them and their Heirs forever.

Item My Will and desire is that if either of my two youngest sons David or Edwin should die without lawful Heire of their body for their Legacy the Land excepted to be equally divided between my two Grandsons Sam Ricks and Peter Tuteal to them and their Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson Jason Ricks one feather bed and Furniture to him and his Heirs forever.

Item My Will and desire is that my Plantation whereon I now live should be sold with the Land thereabouts belonging and the money arising from the sale the one half to my two young sons, David Ricks and Edwin Ricks to them and their Heirs as apnised.

Also I give to my Grandson Jason Ricks two years schooling to be paid out of the sale of my Land, as for the remaining part of the money I give to be equally divided among my three daughters, Sarah Tuteal, Martha Tuteal and Sarahah Collier to them and their Heirs forever.

And I do nominate and appoint my two Sons in Law David Tuteal & Thomas Tuteal, wife and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament disannulling all other wills therfore made by me the thirtyninth my Year and first this 4th day of November 1790.

Winborne Jenkins Will

In the name of God amen. That I Winborne Jenkins of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but in sound mind and disposing memory of mind do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

Item My Will and desire is that all my just debts be paid.

Item I leave unto my beloved wife Anna Jenkins the Land and Plantation whereon she now lives also two hundred and seventy two acres known by the name of the Body farm also the labor of four Negroes to wit Mike, Lucy, Crop old & Dick and Charles also all my Cots of every kind, Horses, Cattle Hogs & swine her undivided and after her marriage the above property to be disposed of as follows hereafter, also the Cots of every kind now on the plantation.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Winborne Jenkins the Land and Plantation whereon he now lives containing one hundred and three acres the same more or less and bounded as follow to wit beginning at a Maple in Pottery Creek thence along a line of marker trees to a Hickory in the pasture line then the pasture line then the various corners of the said pasture to the said plantation to him and his heirs forever also a negro girl named Jemmy and her surname also one stall with the unpaired Maremark belonging the Negro and the stall ad until the death or marriage of her mother and my Cedar bush to him and his Heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Jenkins the Land Plantation whereon I now live containing one hundred acres more or less and bounded as follow to wit beginning at a Maple in Pottery Creek thence along a line of marker trees to a Hickory in the pasture line thence the pasture line to Bonyard Tuteal line, thence his line to the Captain of John Dickinsons line to the said Creek, thence the various corners of the town of
