In the name of God amen I James Roy of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body the of sound mind and memory do make and constitute this my last will and Testament in manner and form following, First I recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God my creator who gave the same and my body to be buried at the discretion of my Executors and attaching such worldly goods as God has been pleased to bestow upon me in this world, I give and bequeath in manner I form following.

Item I Give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Roy to her and her heirs forever the Land Plantation whereon now live with all the appurtenances thereunto belonging together with one Negro Boy named Jeff also two Negro fifteen head of cattle, eighteen head of Hogs. Also my household furniture with all my Just debts —

I do constitute and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth Roy my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and affixed my Seal this 2nd day of October A.D. 1786.

Joseph Boon's Will

In the name of God amen I Joseph Boon of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina calling to mind that it is appointed for all men even to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. First I recommend my soul to almighty God who gave it me & my body to the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner trusting in a glorious resurrection through the merits of my dear redeemer Jesus Christ &c.

Item I leave to my living wife Sary Boon all my Land & lands with all my household furniture and Stock of all kinds with plantation utensils to her use during her natural life, after wards to be disposed of in the following manner. Vizt I desire that after my wife's death —

Item I give and bequeath to my living Son William Boon all my Land & lands with all my household furniture and Stock of all kinds with plantation utensils to him & his heirs forever. I do constitute and appoint to this my last Will & Testament my friends John Boon and John Ely my Executors to see the same performed agreeable to the true intent & meaning hereof Given under my Hand and Seal this 24th day of July 1790
