In the Name of God Amen, I Thomas Dole of Northampton
County and State of Massachusetts, being of Perfect Memory,
do hereby declare, and being to make my last Will and Testament, as follows:—
I have to my beloved Wife Sarah Dole during her natural life and
and Personal, after paying my just debts, to her and unto
my Daughter Rebecca Dole Marrie a comely age, at what
time there shall be a Divisor between my said Wife Sarah
Dole and my Daughter Rebecca Dole as follows:—
I have to my said Wife Sarah Dole during her natural life
and Personal, also all my lands and stock of all kinds with
household and Kitchen Furniture shall be equally divided
between them both, and my Daughter Rebecca Dole shall
have the use of the one half of the said Estate when she
ceasing her natural life, but if she dies without any
Lawful Heir the same is to return back to my loving
Wife Sarah Dole, when she shall have—
My Daughter Rebecca Dole should, at her death have in her
a Heir Lawfully begotten of her Body the half of my
Estate which she is to have the use of them the same as
she should, during her natural life and Personal
to her and unto her Power, and as long as my
Estate to my loving Wife Sarah Dole until my said
Wife Sarah Dole Marrie a comely age, and my said
Loving Wife Sarah Dole is for the use of the whole
to keep a faithful Maintenance for my said Daughter
until such time the above Divisor is made—
This appears to my true Will and Testament my loving
Wife Sarah Dole Executed, with my Friends John
Humble the deacon and others in the Presence of
us this 20 day of March 1804 Thomas Dole
Signed Sealed and Delivered in Presence of
Richard Reed

Northampton County 11 September 1838

as Executor to the above will and was to be certified otherwise.
