

Francis Dolys Will

In the Name of God Amen I Francis Dolys of Northampton County late of Northampton living of Repent Ministry doth be leg'd. and belong to me and my Heirs my Testimony to the my last Will and Testimony as follows —

First to my beloved Wife Sarah Dolys living Estate both me and Russell, after paying my just debts, to her and unto my Daughter Abigail Dolys Morris a sum of age, at what time there shall be a Division between my self & self & Daughter Abigail Dolys as follows — First, a sum of money with their Sonnes, namely Hannah Easter Manger by £1000, also along board and starch of all kind with household & Kitchen Furniture shall be equally divided between them both, and my Daughter Abigail Dolys shall have the rest of the one half of the said Estate where shee during her natural life, live up the Quay without any trouble her the same as to return back to my loving — wife Sarah Dolys the Carpenter but if my Daughter Abigail Dolys should at her death leave her a sum lawfully left her after the pay of my Estate which she is to have the rest of from the time of her death during her natural life given and bequeath to her and her forever, and as long as my Estate to my loving Wife Sarah Dolys with my Daugher Abigail Dolys Morris a sum of age, she my dear loving Wife Sarah Dolys for the rest of her life to keep a gently Maintaine her and Daughters until such time the above Summes is made —

Also appertaining to my last Will and Testament my loving wife Sarah Dolys Executed, with my Friends John Howland the Surveyor and Surveyor in the Province of New England of March 1804 Francis Dolys Esq

Northampton County Her Will and desire was that all of her Estate should go to she equally divided between her Sister Mary Purvis, and her Brother Miles Purvis independent, she in fear of all the wants of her Relations — Humphrey Byrnes who being duly sworn did before say that on the Tuesday before the Saturday night, or Friday evening before she die, said that she asked the said Miles Purvis if she thought she would die the same day she did, she said, and she replied I wish for her Property to go to Sally Miles Purvis, & requested his to take Notice of it, and that she did not want any of the rest to have a Parting of it committed to writing this 17th April 1805 and witness to before me Mary Purvis Wm

and pointed R.C and Lanting Head, If she will
bequeath to her and her three sons jointly said
young Virginian Mary give to her and her three sons
I give unto George Atwell the sum of one thousand
to him and his three sons
Also unto the three of my Daughters Elizabeth Combs
Anne Mansing, Emily Mansing, Henry Combs, & John
Combs, one Dollar to be equally Divided between
and their Misses forever.
