after that my Will & desire is that after my decease my Daughter
Volley should have one of my Beasts & Furniture also

I Give unto my son Nathan Pritchard five Shillings

I Give unto my son Job Pritchard my two Negro Girls Amy & Pleasant
Also all the remainder of my Property that is not given away by my
desire is that my son Job should be my Executor to this my
Last Will & Testament in Witness whereunto I have set my hand
& Seal this 17th Day of October 1800

Wasson, Edmund from Elizabeth my Daughter to him & their
Heir for ever as Witness I hereunto set my hand & Seal this 18th
Day of August 1800 I appoint Henry Sauls & John Nickols
sole Executors
