In the Name of God Amen William Boon of the County of Northampton and State of Massachusetts being sick in Body the of sound Mind and Memory make do to give for the blessing and calling to trust the Rectitude of the body and knowing it is appointed for all Men and it is to make such a claim this my last Will and Testament in Maner and form following (w) after my last debt of Honour and Honour are paid I give I bequeath to my dear James Boon all my land and one Wagon Bay by the Name of Lake one Horse called Nuttall my new saddle and Bridle one Bed of Honour and my last Barrow etc and twenty pounds in Money to him and his heirs forever.

I give I bequeath to my Daughter Sally Boon one Hanger Saddle and black one further Bed of Honour to her the same I give I bequeath to my Daughter Sally Boon one Star Blanket one Clock one further Bed of Honour to her the same I have My Will and desire is that my Wife shall have a comfortable Support out of my Estate during her

Life, and the use of a Cow and Calf while she continues at my place I have my Wife Woman settled to be there and while my youngest Daughter comes of age or Marries after which time for her the same to be equally divided between my two Daughters also it is my Will and desire that all the remainder of my Estate be divided Equally divided between my two Daughters, to have their heirs forever. I do authorize and appoint my Loving Brother William, William Shuckler, John Shuckler, Benjamin Shuckler, to be my lawful Executors to this my last Will and Testament, rendering all other Executors gone hence and authorizing this and as other to be my last Will and Testament, the Witness my hand and Seal this fifth day of October one thousand eight hundred and thirty four.
