In the name of God Amen Margaret Roberts of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina, being at present of reasonable health of body and perfect memory of mind thanks be given unto God therefore, but calling to mind the uncertainty of this life & that it is appointed for all flesh to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form following

Item I give to my Son Samuel Roberts two shillings.

Item I give to my Son James Roberts two shillings.

Item I give to my Son John Roberts two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Roberts two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Fathie Scott two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Christian Stewart two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Phoebe Roberts two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Hannah Roberts two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Milla Lawrence two shillings.

Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Roberts two shillings.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Delpha Roberts all the rest of my estate to her and her heirs forever.

I do appoint Samuel Anderson and my Daughter Delpha Roberts my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament, disannulling & making void all other wills by me made appertaining thereto and as often to be my last Will and Testament.

Frederick Farrow's Will

In the name of God Amen. Frederick Farrow being weak of body but of a sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament.

First My Will and desire is that all my worldly debts be paid.

Second I give and bequeath unto my Brother John Farrow all my Lands in the State of Georgia to him and his heirs forever.

Third I give and bequeath unto my Brother Benjamin Farrow two Negro Girls by the names of Buck and Amy to him and his heirs forever.

Fourth I give and bequeath unto my Brother Andrew Farrow all the residue of my estate to him and his heirs forever.

Fifth I do make and ordain my Brother Andrew Farrow my whole and sole executor to this my last Will and Testament As Witness my hand and Seal this 28th day of August 1794.
