of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina, being at present of reasonable health of body and perfect memory of mind thanks be given unto God therefore, but calling to mind the uncertainty of this life & that it is appointed for all flesh to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following vizt

Item I give to my Son Samuel Roberts two shillings

Item I give to my Son James Roberts two shillings

Item I give to my Son John Roberts two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Mary Roberts two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Judith Scott two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Christian Stewart two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Phoebe Roberts two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Hannah Roberts two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Anna two shillings

Item I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Roberts two shillings

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Delphine Roberts all the rest of my estate to her and her heirs forever

I do appoint Jacobiah Anderson and my Daughter Delphine Roberts my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament, disannulling & making void all other wills by me more apprising this and no other to be my last Will and Testament.

Frederick Farver's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Frederick

Farver being weak of body but of a sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament.

Third I give and bequeath unto my Brother Benjamin Farver two Negro Girls by the names of Dick and Amy to him and his Heirs forever.

Fourth I give and bequeath unto my Brother Andrew Farver all the residue of my estate to him and his Heirs forever.

Fifth I do make and ordain my Brother Andrew Farver my whole and sole executor to this my last Will and Testament As Witness my Hand and Seal this 28<sup>th</sup> day of August 1794
