In the name of God Amen I Thomas Mann of the County of Northampton in the County of Northampton being through the accidental injury and going of God though weak in body yet of a sound and perfect understanding and mind do hereby constitute this my last Will and Testament and desire that it may be received by all as such, First I give my body to the Earth from whence it was taken, as for my burial I desire it may be decent & without pomp or State at the discretion of my dear wife and my executors hereafter named as to my worldly estate I will and bequeath under that and all my debts be paid

First I Give unto my loving wife the House whereon I now live and the Plantation with Stock of all kinds at Horse Cattle Hogsge Sheep &c also two Negroes her own named Tom the other named Lew and my several women Servants Trade during her natural life or Widowhood and after her death or marriage to descend unto my dear Frederick Mann.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Silvia Martha one Negro Girl named Phillis her own & Calves two Cows Hens and fowls her bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Susannah one Negro Girl named Anne to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Thomas Mann one Negro Girl named Anne to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Son Frederick Mann one Negro named Sam one Negro named Lud and one named Anna also my two several Hens Trade and John Trade and his share and he give unto my beloved son Frederick Mann all the Land and plantation whereon I now live with the Stock of all kinds as Horses Cattle Hogsge Sheep &c with all the movables of all kinds in store and out doors with all things whatsoever belonging or in any way appertaining to me to her and her heirs forever after the decease of his Mother.

Lastly

Lastly I constitute this my last Will and Testament and make my executors to be my whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament which this is the year of our Lord 1791 at New York the said Thomas Mann have along Read and Seal.

William Thompson's Will

In the name of God Amen the 24th day of December in the year of our Lord 1792 I William Thompson of the County of Northampton State of North Carolina being weak and unable in body but of perfect mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and declare this my last Will and Testament that is to say as follows.

First I Give and bequeath to Hannah my dear wife the plantation whereon I now live with all the household furniture utensils beds and every thing else I am now possessed with I give her also all my Stock of every kind with all my Negroes namely George Kate Dick Edna Anthony James Nancy Amy and Fanny to her and her heirs forever.

Item I Give unto William Thompson a trust friend whereon he now lives one hundred acres more or less to him and his heirs forever.

Item I Give and bequeath unto William Thompson Son of John Thompson the late whereon the said John Thompson do's formerly live to her and her heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath unto Mary Davis my dear daughter whom she is
now sleeping at the present in my last will and testament a Black & white
swamp in a piece from Thomas North & Parsons land to her and her heirs
forever.

Mem I Give unto my Brother Charles Thompson ten acres of land more or less
wherein he now lives to him and his heirs forever.

I make and ordain my only and sole Executor my Wife Deborah Thompson
and William Thompson son of Charles Thompson of this my last will and
testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and annul all and every
other former Testament Will, Bequest, Bequest and Executor by me be
any wise made, ratified and confirming this and so that to be my
last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
my Hand and Seal the day and year above written.

Arthur Stephenson's Will

In the name of God Amen I Arthur Stephenson of Northampton County and State
of North Carolina being at this time of a sickening mind and weary thereof
do to God first therefore willing to mind the mortality of my body know
that it is appointed for me that I will die do make and declare this my
last Will and Testament in the following manner and form.

First I will that all my actual debts be paid.

Mem I Give and bequeath unto my friend Dr William Stephenson five shillings
to him and his heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Lewis five shillings to her
and her heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Lewis five shillings to
her and her heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Lewis five pounds current
money of the State to her and her heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath to my daughter Mildred Lewis five pounds current
money of the State to her and her heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath to my daughter Deidra Stephenson five pounds current
money of the State to her and her heirs forever.

Mem I Give and bequeath to my daughter Lucy Coffin five pounds current
money of the State to her and her heirs forever.

Mem I bequeath the value of all my Negroes and the half of all the other part of my
estate to my wife as long as she lives a widow.

Mem I Give and bequeath unto my son Abraham Stephenson all the remainder
part of my estate whatsoever kind it be to him and his heirs forever.

And I do appoint my son Abraham Stephenson my friend Benjamin
Brew and David Brown just Executors of this my last Will and Testament
writing and acting with all other witnesses before me as
Witness my Hand and Seal the 26th day of October 1794.
