

John Wall's Will

In the name of God Amen I John Wall of Northampton County and  
set of both hands, long and full of perfect mind and memory thank be given  
unto God and calling unto me the mortality of my body and knowing health  
so infirmate, for all men can die so mickle and certaine that my last Will and  
Testament that is to say, principally and first of all, I Give and remeind  
my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my body I  
recommend to the Earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the  
discretion of my Executors acting deffidit, but at the general resurrection  
shall rise the same again by the power of God and as touching such  
mortal estate wherewith I hath pleased God to apparel me with in this  
life I give and desirre of the same in the following manner and  
form: —

Fiftieth I Give and bequeath to my son John Hall twenty five acres of land now called  
Long and being in the County of Greenville and State of Virginia above me  
Guy Head, or further bed and furniture my Cow and Yearling and the  
Hogs hales are called his to him and his Heirs forever.

Second I Give and bequeath to my son William Hall one hundred and sixtide  
and sixty feet on feather bed and furniture, a Cow and Yearling to him  
and his Heirs forever.

Third I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Cherry Hall one bed and furniture  
and one other that is now called hers to her and her heirs.

Fourth I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Betty Nicholas one Cow & Yearling  
to her and her Heirs.

Fifth I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Deborah Hall twenty shillings  
Virginia money to be paid by my Executors.

Sixth I Lead to my loving wife Martha Hall the plantation whereon I now live  
and all the rest and residue of my estate for and during her natural life  
and from and immediately thereafter I give and devise the said plantation  
to my son William Hall to him and his Heirs forever, also one Negroe  
woman named Dinah also I give and devise one aged woman named  
Sarah to my son John Hall to him and his Heirs, and all the residue  
after the death of my wife to be equally divided between my two sons John  
and William Hall, and I do hereby appoint Robert Sykes Executor of  
this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto

set my hand and Seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of October 1793.

Maudow Daughtrey's Will

In the name of God Amen I Maudow Daughtrey of the County of  
Northampton in the Province of North Carolina being of sound mind &  
memory thanks be to God for it for calling to mind the mortality of my  
body so mortal and certaine that my last Will and Testament is made  
and from following, that is to say first I command my Soul to God and  
my body to be buried in a decent Christian like manner as touching any  
such temporal estate as I hath pleased Almighty God to bestow on me  
I give and desirre as manner and form following:

Sixth I Give and bequeath to my son Lewis Daughtrey the plantation wherein  
he lives containing one hundred and fifty acres lying on the south side  
of a small streame Lovers Run and more neare on the South side of said  
run, likewise I give and bequeath to him one acre more by the name of Pigeon to him and his Heirs forever. —

Seventh I Give and bequeath to my son Joseph Daughtrey the maner plantation  
whereon I now live containing two hundred acres of land more or less and  
more by the name of Little Run Cow Holes all my working tools and gun  
one large Bed, two smaller plates, one feather bed, to him and his Heirs forever.

Eighth I Give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Brown for shillings to  
her and her Heirs.

Ninth I Give and bequeath to my daughter Sabey Daughtrey one large Dish, three plates,  
one Cow Calf one Sheep, one feather bed, one long and gear to her  
and her Heirs. —
