Item I give and bequeath unto my Wife Elizabeth Wood One
maple desk, three walnut chairs, one Coal Table, of walnut, One
half of my Pitcher furniture and one York of Cane to her and
her Heirs forever.

Item It is my will and desire that all the residue of my estate not
before given away should be sold by my Executor and pay
all my just debts, should there remain a balance after my
debt is paid, its my will and desire that it should be equally
divided between my wife and children.

I also nominate and appoint Isaac Wood, John Belliard Euston
and my wife Elizabeth Wood Executrix of this my last
Will and Testament, revoking and disannulling all other Wills
or Wills, and as other to be taken for my last Will and
Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand
and Seal this seventh day of May 1796.

James Marr's Will

In the name of God Amen I James Marr of Southampton County and
State of North Carolina being weak in body but in my perfect sound mind
and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament
and first I command my soul into the hands of Almighty God and
my body to the dust from whence it came to be buried in a Christian
like manner at the discretion of my executors, and as touching my
worldly estate wherewith the Lord has blessed me with I give
settle and dispose of in the following manner vizt

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Lemuel Marr One Third part
of all my Land to him and his Heirs and my Negroes known
by the names of Adam, Jenny, his wife Ether Child Mary, Sherry
and Isham and all the increase hereafter, and the Bay Bittery
which he rides (and the Horse which is called Stephenas) One
if he goes to live for himself by the 25th December next and if
not the same to go with the rest of my estate (otherwise) I give
him Twenty barrels of Corn of them is as much left after the
Beggs as fall to his share & if not to remain in the estate
and I give him One thousand weight of Pork.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Millie Marr One Third
part of all my Land to her and her Heirs and her Negroe Bessie
Simon and Isham which brought of Bushkin and One
feather bed and furniture to be kept in good order by the
estate until she comes of age and One hundred pounds Virginia
Currency if there is perfectly enough to gain it and if not
Lemuel Marr to make the deficiency up and I give her my
Buffet to her and her Heirs.

Item I lead unto my beloved wife Millie Marr One Third part of all my
lands and at her death to be equally divided between my Son
Lemuel Marr and my Daughter Millie Marr, I give her my
Negroe Bessie and Riss, and the Bay Horse which was
brought of John Hart and I give her four Barrels of
her Choice and One feather bed and furniture and twenty
barrels of Corn if there is as much left after the Beggs as fall
and I give her One thousand weight of Pork.

It is my will and desire that Lemuel Gray should keep Mitty Marr's two smallest Negroes and support them for the term of ten years on his own expense.

And my Will and desire is that the rest of my estate should be sold and after my just debts is paid to be equally divided between my Son Lemuel Marr and my Daughter Mitty Marr.

And I do hereby nominate and appoint my Son Lemuel Marr, Isaac Parker and William Glanvaux my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, devises, Legacies and bequests ratifying and confirming this to be my last Will and Testament IN WITNESS whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my Seal this 10th day of May anno

Marmaduke Norfleet's Will

In the name of God Amen I Marmaduke Norfleet of the province of North Carolina and County of Northampton being upwards of seventy four years of age and being in perfect sound mind and memory and calling to mind the mortality of all mankind, as willing to settle all my temporal affairs my senior journey is to Almighty God to review my Soul after death and that my body may be buried in a decent Christian like manner at the discretion of my executors whom I shall hereafter appoint my just debts being first paid. Having satisfied, I do dispose of the remainder of my estate in form and manner as follow.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Ruben Norfleet several parcels of land and timber lying on the North side of Roanoke river and joining each other and lying in both Northampton County & Roanoke County being the lands which I bought of James Gilmer Benjamin Faxon & Ruben Norfleet & Richard & John Whitaker likewise the lands on the South side of Roanoke river that I have already made over to my son Ruben Norfleet by a Deed of Gift I do acknowledge it to be a free gift all the above mentioned Lands I give to my Son Ruben Norfleet and his Heirs forever, Likewise give to my Son Ruben Norfleet a parcel of Negroes that he has had in possession for some time past that is to say one Negroe man called Harry one Negroe man called Daniel, one Negroe man called Abram one Negroe woman called Haga, and all her children excepting one Negroe girl called Anna, Likewise I give him one Negroe woman called Rose and all her children, Likewise I give him one Negroe man called Tony, Likewise I give him one Negroe woman called old Nancy Likewise give to my Son Ruben Norfleet all my Stock of cattle and Hogs that is under the care of Miles Young and the work house & pleugh belonging to that plantation where Miles Young lives and a young slave called Dennis.

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Judith Baker the Land and plantation wherein Joshua Fletcher now lies on the east side of the Liffey Creek being the Land that I bought of William Brundish lying and being in Bedford County, I say I give it to her and her heirs, but if she should die without an Heir begotten of her body my will is that it should fall to my Son
