Sullivan & Thomas Smith all my Estate that I have
hereby given I Give to my Wife, Fanny Smith, to be
equally divided between these three Sons Drury, Samuel
James, Smith & Thomas Smith to them and their heirs
forever.

And I do constitute and appoint two, Jameson, Thomas
Smith & Drury Smith, my Executors & Sole Executors
of this my last Will and Testament.

William Short's Will

In the Name of God Amen. I William Short of
the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina being
Sick in body but of perfect recollection & memory, do make
I Ordain this to be my last Will & Testament, in Manner
& form following (Wit).

I Give unto my Wife, Rebecca Short, during her
Natural Life, the land in the following boundary
(to wit) beginning at the mouth of the Rockwell Branch,
where it empties into Rockwell Run, thence with John Short's
line, to the Halfway Road to a pine, starting Paddy &
John Short's Run, thence a straight line to a scrub
Oak, a corner between said Paddy & myself, thence from
said scrub Oak a North Run until it strikes the
Ricker, fork Road, thence North with said Road to
a pine & a maple, thence in the deep bottom branch
thence down the said branch to Rockwell Run, thence
down the meander of said Run to the first Station
including all House, & Orchard.

I Give & bequeath unto my Wife, Rebecca Short the following
Negro, (to wit) BENN, Fanny, John Child, Betsy & Mary
& their future increase to her the Wife & Children forever.
