I desire my Executors hereafter named to sell the Residue  
 of my Land in a series of three Equal Annual payments  
 all to be paid six percent Interest from the day of Sale  
 until paid & the money arising from such Sale I give  
 & bequeath unto my son Thomas Henry Short & his heirs  
 forever.

I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Henry Short the  
 following Negro (to wit) Sam, a ~~Wagon~~, ~~Table~~ &  
 Sarcophagus at the Marriage of my said wife Rebecca  
 or her Death if before Marriage also one Negro Girl  
 named China a ~~Wagon~~ ~~Table~~ ~~Chair~~ ~~one~~  
 in possession of my wife until she the said China  
 is fourteen years of age I also give him my large writing  
 Desk at his coming of age or marriage.

I give & bequeath unto my wife Rebecca Short one  
 half of the crop now or hereafter growing.

I desire all the Residue of my personal property be  
 sold, & the money arising from such sale I desire be  
 applied to the discharge of my debts, and the surplus  
 if any I give & bequeath unto my son Thomas Henry  
 Short should there not be a sufficiency from the last  
 mentioned sale.

I desire all debts due me to be applied to the discharge of  
 my debts & then the surplus if any to be divided  
 Equally between my wife & son Thomas, but should  
 there be a sufficiency due me to pay what I owe  
 then the above sale are not to be used for such  
 purpose but to descend and belong to my son Thomas  
 Henry Short forever.

I nominate & appoint my wife Rebecca Short Executor  
 & my friends John Short & Howell Nubby Executors  
 to this my last will & Testament hereby revoking all  
 Wills heretofore by me made. In Witness whereof

I do hereby appoint my trusty friend John Blake my wife and son's Executor of this my last Will & Testament Reserving making void all other Wills heretofore made by me in this respect I have heretofore set my hands and seal (and affixed my Seal this 7th March 1801)

### John Watkins Will.

In the Name of God Amen. I John Watkins of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being sick and weak in body but in perfect sound mind & disposing memory of mind thank be to almighty God but calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it is appointed for all flesh to die do make and Ordain this my last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 10th day of March 1801. I do hereby bequeath my soul into the hands of almighty God that gave it, relying on the precious blood of my blessed Saviour to have full remission of all my sins and my body I commit to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named and as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath of in manner and form following.

I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Watkins the Land and plantation whereon I now live containing two hundred and twelve and a half acres more or less the one half of the said Acre that I bought of James Wright. But it is my will and desire that my daughter Sally Watkins should have three Barrels Corn yearly as long as she shall live and be freed her from said half of said Acre. My will also is that my Sorrowful son Samuel Woodson son of Sally Woodson should have three Barrels Corn likewise her out of the profit of said Acre until the said Samuel shall arrive to the age of twelve years and no longer. I also give my said son Benjamin Watkins three Negro (to wit) Henry Abby and Daniel also another Negro by the name of Day or young Boy more called by the name of boy, one of either bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my Nelly Donda one horse which she has now in her possession one feather bed and furniture one Negro boy by the name of Abraham one Negro boy the name of Sam to her and her heirs forever.

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Watkins one Horse Bed & chest one feather bed and furniture one Negro boy ten one Negro girl called one Cow & calf to her and her heirs forever.

I bequeath unto my beloved daughter Sally Watkins during of Natural Life one Negro Boy by the name of Lewis one Negro woman by the name of Susan one feather bed and furniture one Cow & calf and in lieu my said daughter should be married and have half of the price of her Body then I give such part of the estate of said property to be equally divided between them then and then alike and for the want of such issue I give the said property at the death of said daughter Sally to be equally divided between all my children whom I have alike to them and their heirs forever.
