Anthony & Williams's Will

In the Name of God Amen I Anthony & Williams of the County
of Northampton and State of North Carolina Being Weak of
Body but of sound and perfect Memory do make this be
statement to be my last Will and Testament in Manner &
Form following (To wit)

I give & bequeath to my Father Thomas Williams five hundred

Dollars

I give & bequeath unto my Sister Margaret Williams five hundred Dollars

I give & bequeath to Littlebury Mason my slave Malah
to have and her thing forever

My Will and desire is that my land known by the Name
of Oakleys Plantation and Mrs. Williams and one Eight
Part of the land known of Christopher Chatham
known by the Name of their Farm house be sold for
Cash Money here is and which is on the date one thousand
and Eight hundred and Eighty Dollars the Money to be
also all my Goods that is on hand be sold on a part
of Nine Months and the Cash that is on hand be

sent to Petersburg immediately and sold for Cash to pay my
debts and the Money arising from the above mentioned
Land and going to discharge the above Legacies and in
discharging my last debts

Then

I have unto my beloved Wife Elizabeth Williams all the Room
and all of my whole Estate both real & Personal as
long as she may live Single & my Son Anthony William
arriving to the Age of Eighteen by my Will then my desire is that
at either of those Periods that a Divisor should take Place
and that my Wife Elizabeth Williams shall have in third
Part and my Son Anthony shall have in third Part to
at the Death of my Wife the said one third Part to

return to my Son Anthony the said Williams to have and his
heirs forever the my desire is that if my Son Anthony
the said Williams should die before he coming to the age of
Eighteen years old & Mary that my beloved Wife shall
have the following Negroes (To wit) Males, Sells, Charles,
Miles, Joe, James, John, Charity, Charles, Em, Buttons,
Deliver, Lucy, Amy, Abby, Sarah, Lucy, Nelson, & Maggie
also one half of all my Stock of Horses, Mules, Cattle, Hogs,
and a Shop and all my Household Furniture and my De-
artments that I now live on bounded by the thing that I
now hold it by with one half of my Plantation sit-
uate to be and here this forever and if my Son Anthony
the said Williams should die before he coming to the age of

Eighteen years old & Mary that the Balance of all my
Cash and Money and all my other Property not before
mentioned to be sold and the Money arising from
such sale to divide & hereafter divided

Then

I give one third Part of the above mentioned Sale of the Land
and Money to my Father Thomas Williams

Then

I give one third Part of such Sale to my Sister Margaret
H. Williams and my Wife of that one third of such Sale
shall be paid out on interest by my Executors and the
interest arising thereon to be paid to my Sister Betty
every annually and if my Sister Betty long should live

I Judge that his Executors Richard Long that she may Receive
 the one third Part Immediately at her own disposal —
 I do hereby constitute and appoint my Wife Elizabeth
 William's Executor, Manager of William's & William's Heirs Executors
 also Elizabeth Maria Executors but not to act until he arrives to
 the age of twenty Two Years unless very good Reasons should
 to the Court for his being appointed, of this my last
 Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set
 my hand and seal my last this 10th day of January
 Anno Domini 1867

Arnold Magan's Will.

In the Name of God Amen I Arnold Magan of North
 ampton County and State of North Carolina do at Present
 very sick and Weak of Body but of sound and disposing
 Mind and Memory think be to solemnly say therefore
 and calling to mind that it is appointed for all Men
 to die will do make and make this my last Will
 and Testament in the following Words and Matters (To-wit)

First I do Request unto my two Sons Benjamin and David
 all my Land to be Equally Divided Between them
 to have their Heirs forever.

Second I do Request unto my Daughter Mary a Negro
 By the Name of Sale to her good her Heirs forever.

Third I do Request unto my three Children Elizabeth
 Benjamin & Maria to make me my own Money held &
 her Successors to have their Heirs forever.

Then I do make my beloved Wife Elizabeth during her Natural Life
 a Widow have the use of one Negro Man by the Name of
 Abraham and afterwards give Michael to my two Sons
 David & Abel to have & their Heirs forever.

Then I do make my Daughter Elizabeth one Sea & from time to go
 one half to her and her Heirs forever.

Then I give unto my son David one Sea & from time to have & their Heirs
 forever.

Then I give unto my son Benjamin one Sea & from time to have & their Heirs
 forever.

Then I give unto my son David one Sea & from time to have & their Heirs
 forever.

Then I give unto my daughter Mary one Sea & from time to have & their Heirs
 forever.

Then My Wife and I agree that all the Rest of my Property to
 be equally Divided Between my two Sons David and
 Benjamin and my Grand Son Henry back to them & their Heirs forever.
 I do make and appoint Richard Henry and William
 Suggs as my Wife and I Executors of this my last
 Will and Testament hereby Revoking all other Wills made
 by me before in Writing hereof I have hereunto set my
 Hand and Seal this 21st day of August 1866
