

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Felia born two Negroes that is to say one Negro man by the name of Sam and one Negro girl by the name of Susie to her and her heirs forever I also give my Daughter Felia two beds and furniture the bed she calls hers and the bed whereon I now lie I also give my Daughter Felia my best and best table and one chest that she calls hers and one Bay mare and one brown Colt by the name of Peace I also give to my Daughter Felia all the Cattle that she calls hers I also give to my Daughter Felia my largest Iron Pot and one Iron Kettle

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Patience born two Negroes one by name by the name of Lot and one girl by the name of Hannah to her and her heirs forever I also give my Daughter Patience born my strong water still and my riding horse and my Iron share and the remaining part of my white Cattle I also give to my Daughter Patience the bed and furniture whereon she doth lie and my best and best horse one red and the other blue and two square tables one green and white and one brown and all the harness belonging thereto and one spinning wheel also one glass wheel a sign of my best chairs two Iron pots one white one and my best flying pan, my hand sickle, and my Iron, my desire is that the remaining part of my estate after paying my debts may be equally divided between my two Daughters Felia born and Patience born, I do constitute and appoint Benjamin Sheppard Arthur Sheppard and my son John born to be the whole and sole Executors of this my last Will and Testament to wit the same persons surviving to the intent thereof As Witness my hand and seal this 10th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty eight

Henry Augustine Wood's Will Best known

I Henry Augustine Wood of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and memory, and calling to mind that it is appointed for man even to die do make and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament Wilt

- Item I leave unto my Wife Elizabeth Wood the Lease and plantation whereon Lemuel Cotton now lives during her natural life
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my wife Elizabeth Wood three Negroes Minny, Henry & Wen to her and her heirs forever, also my black horse and single chair two beds and furniture and a large looking glass
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son Samuel Wood the following Negroes Cep, Luc, Stephen, Lias, Rachel, and send to him and his heirs forever
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son Peyton Wood one Negro called Haroon to him and his heirs forever
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son Henry Wood the following Negroes Polipou, York, Lucy, Hector, Kate, & Luke to him and his heirs forever
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son James Wood the lease and plantation that I purchased of Cotton whereon Leonard Holt now lives to him and his heirs forever I also give devise and bequeath unto my son James Wood the following Negroes Peter & Aaron to him and his heirs forever
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son Elisha Augustine Wood (after the death of his Mother Elizabeth Wood) the Lease and plantation whereon Lemuel Cotton now lives containing one hundred & fifty acres more or less to him & his heirs forever
- Item I leave unto my Wife Elizabeth Wood one Negro named Panny during her natural life
- Item I give devise and bequeath unto my son Elisha Augustine Wood the following Negroes Rachel, and Junny to him and his

his heirs forever, I do give and bequeath unto my Son Eliza^d Word^d my Negro called Dinny after his Mother's death to him and his heirs forever.

Item I give devise and bequeath unto my Wife Elizabeth Word One maple Desk, three walnut chairs, one Oak Table, of walnut, One half of my Kitchen furniture and one Yoke of Oxen to her and her heirs forever.

Item In my will and devise that all the residue of my estate not before given away should be sold by my Executor and pay all my just debts, should then remain a balance after my debts is paid, etc my will and devise that it should be equally divided between my wife and children.

I do nominate and appoint Jonas Word, John Richard Executor and my wife Elizabeth Word Executrix of this my last will and Testament, revoking and annulling all other Wills, and as other to be taken for my last will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this seventh day of May 1796.

James Warr's Will

In the name of God Amen I James Warr of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in body but in my perfect sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and Testament and first I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God and my body to the dust from whence it came to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my executor, and as touching my worldly estate wherewith the Lord has blessed me with I give, devise and dispose of in the following manner Wilt.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Son Samuel Warr One third part of all my Land to him and his heirs and my Negroes known by the names of Adam, Nancy, his wife John Child Mary, Sherry and Isham and all the increase hereafter, and the Bay Killy which he rides (and the Horse which is called Stephen's Steer, if he goes to live for himself by the 25th December next and if not the Steer to go with the rest of my estate) I deliver unto him twenty barrels of Corn if there is as much left after the Eggs is sold if he goes to himself & if not to remain in the estate and I give him One thousand weight of Pork.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Milley Warr One third part of all my Land to her and her heirs and Negroes Randol Simon and Isham which I brought of Brackin and One feather bed and furniture to be kept in good order by the estate until she comes of age and One hundred pounds Virginia currency if there is profusely enough to raise it and if not Samuel Warr to make the deficiency up and I give her my Buffot to her and her heirs.

Item I leave unto my beloved wife Milley Warr One third part of all my Lands and at her death to be equally divided between my Son Samuel Warr and my Daughter Milley Warr I give her my Negroes Peter and Rex, and the Bay Horse which was brought of John Clark and I give her four Score & Colours of her Cows and One feather bed and furniture and twenty barrels of Corn if there is as much after the Eggs is sold and I give her One thousand weight of Pork.
