infirm, a body full of sound and perfect mind and memory, do hereby
do the seventh day of May in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety two make and publish this my last Will and
Testament in witness following that is to say.

Now I give and separate with my Brother Sam. Took one Negro who named Sam, one Negro woman named Sarah and one half of my flight and passing of from about Westbury Ki and my brother James to him and his kind friends.

Mean: I give and bequeath to my Mother Lawrence's Book and Gun Shelf

John I give and bequeath to Francis Hunt son of James Hunt one Negro Girl named Betty one Bay two year Old shew Colt and my riding saddle and write to him and his Wife forever.

After I have said farewell to my wife Sarah, there are fifteen more named
among our negroes now named Charles, one negro woman named Eliza
and her Child Chaim, one negro woman named Elna, one negro boy
named Isaac &c &c and her first person. I likewise give and
bequeath to my little Sarah all my House goods and things that
I do not before given away, and the remaining half of my personal
estate to my sons, Edward, Gust, Henry, &c and all my household
and kitchen furniture, also all the remainder of my estate whether within
here or without that was not before given away, all the residue of my
Real and every part thereof I give to my little Sarah there she
paying all my just debts funeral charges &c to her and her heirs forever.
And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend Joshua Freeman, last wife my
little son's next Executor of this my last Will and Testament and I do
make void all former Wills and Testaments and acknowledge this to be
my last Will and Testament and I do hereby certify that I am of sound
Mind and that the day and year above written.

Giles Randolph Will

In the name of God amen I take this solemn and irrevocable Covenant and oath of North Carolina being read in my presence and in the presence of many witnesses to be given to Almighty God for the same but calling to mind the mortality of our nature and that it is ordained for all men now to die to make and receive this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say I give and bequeath my Soul into the hands of Almighty God who goodly keeps for redemption with him through the merits of our Lord Jesus Christ and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touching my worldly estate which I have I leave to be disposed of by my Executors and assigns in the following manner Viz

Mem I have said I gave into my son William Randolph the
correct money to him and his three pence

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I give and bequeath unto my dear John Randolph and his heirs and assigns
all of said joining Irish Grants lying to the Eastward of the
Negro named Peter and Peter's heirs and his heirs forever.

1860 I have and beguote into my son Mallum Randall as he had been
served of land joining my son John Randall the tract and his devious
paved. See and having to him and his heirs forever.

Now I live and agree with my daughter. She
begins to see some of the things to be done.
