Robert Green's Will

In the name of God Amen I Robert Green of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being sick in body but of sound mind and memory and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do constitute & make my last Will as followeth after giving my Soul to God who goes and being trusting upon his dear Son for salvation and my body to be decently buried after the direction of my executor and worthy good Intention of in the manner following.

Supposing That all my just debts shall be paid, after that my desire is that my beloved wife Martha Green should have the use of my whole estate during her widowhood to raise my Children upon, at her marriage or death my desire is that my whole estate shall be equally divided between my Children. I nominate Benjamin Williamson and my beloved wife Martha Green Executrix of this my last Will and Testament declaring it to be my last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this ninth day of December 1795.
