I Clary Bennett of Northampton County and State of St. ^o Carolina
being of sound memory and perfectly in my senses do make
and ordain this to be my last Will and Testament in manner
and form as follows - Item. I leave all and singularly the
whole of my property of every kind, in the hands of my friend
John Piphkin, for him to keep in trust for the support of my
daughter Betty Bennett on this special provision that if my said
daughter should live to mature age and marry, in that case
my will and desire is that she receive said property to the
benefit of herself and her heirs forever; but if she should die
in marriage or before marriage in that case I give all my
said property to my brothers Thomas Lee and my Sister Elizabeth
Lily, to be equally divided between them, share and share alike.
I nominate and appoint said John Piphkin to see this my
last Will fulfilled in every part thereof. In witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16th day of
February 1808.
