Short of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being sick and weak but of perfect mind and recollection, thanks be to God, do hereby make and establish this my last will and Testament, most revoking all other wills by me made in manner and form as follows (to wit). First I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Martha D. Short all my estate both real and personal after paying all my just debts, subject however to the personal maintenance of my Mother Rebecca Short during her natural life (as hereafter named) except two hundred and twenty five and a half acres of land hereafter given to Mary D. Williams to her and her heirs forever. Then I give and bequeath unto my cousin Mary D. Williams two hundred & twenty five and a half acres of land, adjoining the lands of the orphan of Elishah Short dec^d and was formerly the property of my brother John L. Short dec^d to her and her heirs forever. Then I in my will that my Mother Rebecca Short shall have and enjoy her personal maintenance during her natural life out of any estate herebefore given to my wife in first clause. Lastly I appoint my wife wife Martha D. Short Executrix to this my last will and Testament.
