

Agnes Kersey's will November 2nd 1823

In the name of God Amen I Agnes Kersey of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being imperfect with the thoughts of death but in my right mind do make this my last will and Testament.

I give and bequeath unto my grandson Cephal Kersey and to his heirs forever one hundred acres of land it being the land I now live on

I lend to my granddaughter Syndellery Kersey eleven acres of land during her natural life provided she said Syndellery settle and live on said land. If she does not then it shall go back to the sd Cephal Kersey. The said eleven acres of land is to be taken on the Spring Branch so as not to interfere with the house and orchard. I give to my said granddaughter Syndellery one fello bed and one small iron pot. My debt is that all my just debts be paid and then the balance of my personal estate go the sd Cephal Kersey and his heirs. I appoint John Blythe my whole and sole executor

George Artico's will. In the name of God I George

Artico being weak in body but of sound mind and memory blessed be God do make and publish this my last will in manner following to wit I give to my son August Artico 1 bed and furniture which he has now in his chest also all my working tools of all kinds also all my reading books of all kinds and one pair of Stewards and one pair four sitting chairs one chest to hold his gun forever. Item I give to my son Thimcheon station one dollar to him and his heirs forever for his full part of my debt I wish all my just debts to be paid out of the balance of my estate and discharge

I give to my beloved wife three beds of furniture and also all the rest of my estate to her and her heirs forever I hereby make and ordain my writing friend Zachus Martin my sole and sole executor of this my last will disannulling all other. Dated in the presence of us this 30th day of December in the year of our Lord 1819 Witness Gile Switzer & John Switzer

Josiah Blanchard's will. In the name of God

Amen I Josiah Blanchard of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being at this time very weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die I for all the worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow on me I give in the following manner and form (over) I lend to my beloved wife Silveent Blanchard all my lands also my gray mare also all my Cattle except one cow and calf also all my working tools for natural life except my whip and also I want all my boys for the support of the family except five of the best also I lend my four patted beds and furniture to my wife for natural life also I give all my Crop of Corn Cotton and Potatoes for the families support I give and bequeath all my lands to my five sons namely Nathan Blanchard, Jonathan Blanchard, Sepu Blanchard, Josiah Blanchard and William Blanchard at my wife Silveent Blanchard's decease to be equally divided

Also I lend all my negroes to my beloved wife Silveent Blanchard except three I give unto my wife and her heirs forever and Tom Isaac to be sold towards paying my debts Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Martha Blanchard one negro girl named Rhode at my wife's decease Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth one negro boy named Hardy after my wife's decease Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Silveent Blanchard one negro boy named Tom at my wife's decease Also I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Ann one negro boy named Mason at my wife's decease also I give and bequeath unto my son Nathan Blanchard my bay mare one Cow and Calf also I give and bequeath unto my five sons before mentioned two negro boys named Ben and Joshua to be equally divided at my wife's decease all the remainder of my property after taking enough to pay my just debts I lend unto myself for natural life and then all that I have lent unto my beloved wife that is not yet given my will and desire is that at her decease that it should be equally divided between all my heirs namely Nathan Blanchard Jonathan Blanchard Sepu Blanchard Josiah Blanchard William Blanchard Martha Blanchard Elizabeth Blanchard Silveent Blanchard and Mary Ann Blanchard Also my will and desire is that if any of the boys should die under age of twenty one without an heir that their part of the land should go to the other boys I nominate and appoint my son Nathan Blanchard and my wife executor or executrix my two executors to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 18th day of November 1823

John H. Daniels Will. - In the name of God Amen I John H. Daniel of the County of Southampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and Testament in manner following (to wit) first I give and bequeath to my loving wife Christiana Daniel the tract of land whereon I now live together with all and singular the appurtenances thereof to be fully possessed and enjoyed by her during her natural life or widowhood. I give her likewise the bed and furniture wherein she and I commonly lie three sitting chairs & dining table with a Poraw half a dozen knives forks half dozen Dishes & Dishes pot which we now cook in one small brass foot-stool chest one Pairing table one dark rounded Cow 1 spotted Sow and pig & one year provision out my Stock of Corn and pork now on hand & my will and desire is that after the death or marriage of my wife Christiana Daniel the above named property which I have given & bequeath to her be called together by my executor and sold at public auction and the money arising from the sale of the same be equally divided between my daughters Martha M. Daniel and Rebecca G. Daniel to them and their heirs forever. Item and my will and desire is that my Negroan tract of land together with all the sale and of my estate not above named be sold and the money arising from the sale of the same be appropriated to the payment of all my just debts and the remainder whatever it may be equally divided between my three Daughters Anne M. Daniel Martha M. Daniel and Rebecca G. Daniel to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I nominate and appoint my wife Christiana Daniel the sole executrix to this my last will and Testament in & whereon all other wills and Testaments before made by me in any wise whatsoever be vitually whosoever I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of February 1824

Secondly I give unto Sall Pables four negroes by name Japoy Mary John and Washington to her and her heirs forever. Thirdly I give unto John Glover three negroes by name Jimmy Harrod and Sander to him and his heirs forever. Fourthly It is my will and desire that John Glover should keep the above negroes and not suffer them to be hired out and to let them have them as they come of age or marry. Fifthly it is my will and desire that my land that I bought of Captain Lucas D.D.'s above with all my household goods and furniture also all my kitchen furniture all my stock of hove cattle hogs and sheep and plantation tools wagons carts plows be sold and money arising from said sale with all the money that is now ^{in my} equally divided between my sister Sarah's Sons Simon James and John Glover also it is my will and desire John Glover should give unto Eddy Adams yearly what he may think proper to support her out of the above property that is sold to them and their heirs forever And thereby make and ordain my worthy friend John Glover Executor of this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I the said Mary Pables have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal this day and Year above witnessed sealed published and declared by the said Mary Pables the testator as her last will and Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing thereof
