

Thos. Williams's Will. In the name of God Amen I  
Thos. Williams of Northampton County and State of North Carolina do make  
this instrument my last Will and Testament in writing and form as follows with  
testit. I bind the use of the plantation and land wherein I now live my wife —  
Sarah Williams during her life. I also bind her the labor of my negro men Peter  
and Charly and Lucy and Tony & Silva during her life and to descend as  
hereafter directed. Item. I give unto my wife Sarah Williams two beds and  
furniture also four cows and calves four swine and pigs four head of  
sheep and her choice of my horses and as much corn and pack as will  
be sufficient to serve her and family one year. I also bind her all my  
household & kitchen furniture and plantation utensils, that if do not  
hereafter suffice, give away, and at her death my desire is that the  
household and kitchen furniture and every other article that is not  
given away may be sold and the money arising therefrom to be equally  
divided between all my children that may be alive at that time.  
Item. I give unto my son Jefferson Thos. Williams my above mentioned  
land and plantation at the death of my wife Sarah Williams, also  
my land I purchased of the heirs of Drury Polley bounded by the  
seeds I now hold it by. Item I give unto my son Jefferson Thomas  
Williams at the death of my wife Sarah Williams, Peter & Phoeby  
and her increase forever, I also give him time to be hired out for his  
use until he arrives to the age of eighteen, I also give him one bed  
and furniture also four heads of cattle to him and his heirs forever.  
Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Anthony Richard Williams the  
land I purchased of the heirs of John Sawyer decd. also I give him  
the following negroes. Joe: Jones and Charly and her increase  
forever, also one bed of furniture and four cows to him & his heirs forever.  
Item. I give and bequeath to my son Samuel Clark Williams the  
following negroes Jacob, Bob, Tom and Dickey and Amy and their  
increase forever.  
Item. I bind unto Richard and Sally Long the land and plantation  
whereon they now live during their lives, also I bind them the labor  
of the following negroes to wish, Nelly, Will, Sarah and Bob & her  
increase, and if Sarah Long has a child or children that the  
land and negroes at the death of Richard and Sarah Long  
be equally divided between her children, and for want of children  
of her body my desire is that she dies where being dead Samuel  
Clark Williams shall be him and his heirs forever. My further will is  
that the negroes Jacob & Richard and Sarah Long return with my  
estate and be equally divided between my children & myself  
Sally Thomas Richard if she be alive at that time. I also bind  
furniture along my house and all my cattle that is on the plantation  
as long as she lives or if her and Richard Long die before  
Sally Thomas dies she shall have

Item. I give to my daughter Belinda Morrison Williams the following negroes —  
Edmund white and Cheesy and her increase forever, also one bed and furniture  
and four head of cattle.  
Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Harriet Matilda Williams, Belinda  
following negroes to wish, Ned, Dick and Oliver and her increase forever  
and one bed and furniture and four head of cattle.  
Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Julia Tucker Williams the  
following negroes Miles Jack and Silva at her mother's death to her and  
her heirs forever, also one bed of furniture & four head of cattle.  
Item. I give unto my grand daughter Evalina Sally Thomas Nicholson  
one negro man Diego, and at my death the negro to be hired out  
for her use, and if Evalina Sally Thomas Nicholson should die without  
spur of her body the negro Diego is to return to Juliette Williams.  
My further will and desire is that all horses cattle hogs and sheep  
and crop of corn and fodder and every other article that is not  
given away be sold to pay my debts, and my desire is that my  
dwelling house be a home or asylum for all my children & I do  
also appoint my loving wife Sarah Williams, Belinda W.  
Barnes and Elizabeth Edmund my whole sole executors of this  
my last Will and Testament. Whereof I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal, this fifteen day of January eighteen hundred  
and fifteen (1815) — Thos. Williams Seal!

Northampton December Court 1815. This last will & Testament of Thomas  
Williams decd. was exhibited in court and proved in the following manner  
to wit, by Erum Holloman and Frederick Long who made oath and  
swore knowledge of the hand writing of Thomas Williams decd. that they  
believed the said Will and every part thereof to be the only proper  
hand writing of the said testator, and also by the oath of Michael  
Holloman who made oath that the said Will was found among the  
valuable papers of the said decd., and that he believed the same to  
be in the hand writing of the testator, whereupon Belinda W. Barnes and  
of the executors in said will named came into Court & gave their oaths  
in due form of law: ordered that said Will be certified & recorded.

Benjamin Poorn's Will. In the name of God Amen I  
Benjamin Poorn of Northampton County and State of North Carolina  
being at this time well in health thanks be to God. Knowing how  
short the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for  
all flesh to die being of a disposing mind and being in my perfect  
sound senses and memory to make this my last will & Testament in  
following manner and form. Item. I give and bequeath unto  
my Benjamin Poorn all my land that I now own and the same  
by the names of Jack and Mose & one half more shall be  
hereinafter

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Danksford one negro woman named Judah and all her increase to she & her heirs forever. Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Lourier one negro girl by the name of Dorcas to she and her heirs forever. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Pledger one negro boy by name of Jerry, to she and her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Miriam Woodard two negro boys by the names of George and Tom to she and her heirs forever. —

Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Charity Davis five pounds to she and her heirs forever.

Item. My will and desire is that my negro woman named Hilly and her increase be sold at public sale and the money arising from the sale of said negro to remain in the hands of my executors hereafter named and for them to give my daughter Charity twenty five dollars a year till he gives her three hundred dollars. —

Item. My will and desire is that all my property not before mentioned shall be sold at public sale and the money arising from the sale thereof to pay the balance of the negro woman before mentioned should not sell for enough to raise three hundred dollars and also for my executors to pay all my just debts and the balance after all is discharged to be equally divided between four of my daughters to wit Lucy Danksford, Polly Lourier, Rebecca Pledger and Miriam Woodard to them & their heirs forever. —

I do nominate and appoint my son Benjamin Bonn & Elliot Furtule my two executors to whom I do remit and do hereby disannul all other wills hancfor made by me: whereas I do hereby set my hand and affix my seal this 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 1815.

*Herod Faison's Will.* In the name of God Amen I declare Faison Esq. of the County of Northampton of State of North Carolina being of sound mind and disposing memory blessed be God

to make and ordain this my last Will and testament in manner and form as follows to wit this First I give & bequeath unto my son Button Faison one certain tract of land lying on the south side of Coopers Swamp containing one hundred and fifty acres being the land wherein he now lives, and one hundred and twenty six and a half acres of land being the land wherein Smith Parish formerly lived, together with one hundred acres of land lying on the old road it being the land I bought of Burnell Mangar, to him and his heirs forever; also I give unto my son Button Faison one small horse, Richardson his cows and calves one feather bed and furniture together with all and singular his household and kitchen furniture now in his possession. —

Second. I give and bequeath unto my son Herod Faison one certain tract of land containing two hundred and forty seven acres it being the land I purchased of Ego Hays and one certain tract of land I bought of Turner Pebble containing seventy acres to the same more or less together with one small horse it being the horse I bought of Enoch Rains and one bridle and saddle two cows and calves two sows and twenty two pigs sixteen hogs one year old one hundred and fifty bushels of corn one bed & furniture one dish and six plates to him and his heirs forever. —

Third. I lend unto beloved wife Sarah Faison the land & plantation wherein I now live containing two hundred and sixty seven acres together with a certain tract of land I bought of John Mangar containing one hundred acres during her life or widowhood, except one half of my young orchard on said plantation, whereas I wish my son Herod Faison to have one half of said orchard in possession and to be divided as the path runs through the orchard by my dwelling house. I further lend unto my wife Sarah Faison one negro man named Anthony one negro woman named Charlotte one negro girl named Eliza one negro boy named Mariday together with three cows and calves two feather beds and furniture two head of hogs one known by the name of Slick the other known by the name of the Pack horse one riding chair and harness fifty Bushels of corn one chest one trunk two pails one large earthen dish one pewter dish seven pewter plates, one pewter basin one large flowered punch bowl two sows and sixteen pigs and twelve year old hogs six setting chairs for the support and maintenance of herself during her natural life or widowhood. —

Fourth. I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Faison one negro man named Tony and one negro boy named Daniel one black horse known by the name of Sir Andy cold eight head of cattle one bay mare and foal, felly, one bed and furniture together with all and singular his household and kitchen furniture to him & his heirs forever. —

Fifth. I lend unto my daughter Frances Faison one negro man named Nelson one negro woman named Hager and one negro man named Pollio I further lend unto my daughter Frances one feather bed and furniture one large trunk one pewter dish and basin & six plates, whereas my will and desire is that my son Button Faison & Herod Faison board and support her the said Frances Faison and keep her negro woman with her to wait & attend on her and to pay the same all and
