Martha Boykin's Will.

In the name of God Amen I Martha Boykin of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory do this twenty eighth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say -

First my Will and desire is that all my just be paid - Second, I give and bequeath to my grand Daughter Patsy Johnson my negro girl Bett, and also one feather bed and furniture, to her and her heirs forever - also I give to the said (Patsy) and her heirs forever her choice Cows Pigs & sheep of -

Third, My Will and desire is that all the rest and residue of my Estate be equally divided amongst my daughter (Tabitha Johnson) children (Patsy excepted) to them of their heirs forever -

Fourth, I hereby make and ordain my friend Richard Dean my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I the said Martha Boykin have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and year above written -

Joseph Bridgers's Will.

In the name of God Amen, I Joseph Bridgers of Northampton County in the State of North Carolina do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in following manner and form that is to say first my Will and desire is that all my just debts should be paid. Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Harrison Bridgers my old Plantation wherom I now live containing one hundred acres. Item, I give and bequeath unto my two sons Joseph Bridgers and William Bridgers the remainder part of my land which is one hundred and forty one acres and a half to be equally divided between them - Also I lend to my wife Wmne Bridgers one mare, and one cow and calf, and one sow and seven pigs, and one bed and furniture, one dish and six plates, and one loom, and pot and griddle and pan and wooden Wheel and Linen wheel, and three chairs, and chest and table and meal stand enduring her widowhood - Item, I give & bequeath unto my wife Wmne Bridgers six barrels of corn and all the cotton. Also my desire is that the house & Coll shall be sold and the part of my cattle that are lent out to be sold, and the rest of my sheep that are lent out to be sold, & the rest of my hogs that are lent out to be sold, none left to be sold, & the balances of my pewter and earthen ware to be sold, and four be hives and their increase to be sold, & four hogheads, and one oak barrel to be sold, & one pair of Cart wheels to be sold, & one saddle to be sold, & the balance of my iron that are given out to be sold, & all my working tools shall be sold & three sides of leather & one raw hide to be sold, four chairs to be sold - Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Harrison Bridgers one gun - and one gun to be sold, and pair Cart wheel to be sold also. I nominate & appoint John Johnson & Thaddeus Martin junr. my executors of this my last Will this 22nd day of August 1809 his
