Item 6<sup>th</sup> I give to my son Phaniel Roberts the sum of five Shillings —  
 Item 7<sup>th</sup> I give to my Daughter King Roberts the sum of five Shillings.

Item 8<sup>th</sup> I give to my Granddaughter Bess Roberts one Feather bed and Furniture to her and her heirs forever. I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Willis Roberts my Executor to this my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I do hereunto set my hand and Seal the day and year before mentioned.

**Matthew Buffalaw's Will.** In the name of God Amen: I Matthew Buffalaw of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina being in perfect health & of perfect mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of my body & knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows (to wit) I leave to my wife Nancy Buffalaw seven Acres of Land where my dwelling house stands, two feather Beds &c with all my household and Kitchen Furniture with all my

Plantations situated, my Stock of every kind, with one Negro Man to wit, and at the death of my wife I give the seven Acres of Land which I leave to my wife to my son William Buffalaw to — at the death of my wife I leave to be sold and equally divided among my four Daughters, namely, Temperance, Lucy, Martha & Mary Buffalaw all & singular the property not given away. — I give to my Daughter Temperance one bed & Furniture I give to my Daughter Lucy one bed & Furniture to them their heirs & assigns the only tract Land lying in Sampson County North Carolina I give one half to my son William Buffalaw according to our previous agreement the other half I leave to my four Children to be equally divided, namely, William, Temperance, Lucy, Martha & Mary. — I leave my wife one hundred dollars. — I leave & appoint my son William Buffalaw sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. I do hereby revoke & disannul all & every other former testaments, In Witness whereof I set my hand and Seal this 1<sup>st</sup> day of June 1820.
