Second I give and bequeath to my three Sons Charles Francis
 and Philip to have and enjoy the same in fee simple

I give the remainder of my Estate to three of my Children
 to be equally divided among them, namely Charles Francis
 and Philip to have and enjoy the same in fee simple

And my Will and desire is that my Estate be not in-
 ventoried nor appraised

I have nominated and appointed
 John Lacey and William Adams Executors of this my
 last Will and Testament

I hereby certify and confirm this to be my
 last Will and Testament In Witness whereof I have
 written with my hand and affixed my Seal this 16th day
 of April 1810
