I Rebecca Carter believing myself to be in my last day of affliction
designing my body to the dust, and my Soul to God, dispose of my
Worldly estate in the following manner I do all my personal Estate
give and bequeath unto my two Sons Benjamin and Jonas Wood to be
equally divided I also give unto my two Sons Benjamin and Jonas
Wood all the estate which I now have in my possession of every
description to be between them equally divided. There of leave to
be an amount of 4000 Estate left me in South Carolina from there
Leaving as yet been no Settlement. I have not appointed the amount
whereof half my will and desire is that my son Jonas Wood
should have of that Three thousand dollars more than my son Benjamin
now all my will and desire is that my granddaughter William's daughter
Rahel should have of that amount which may be received in South
Carolina 10 years hence and last provided she survives or less, or less
to become twenty one years of age, not otherwise I do give to my
granddaughter William's daughter Rahel all my clothing and my
Portion of Lucretia Reddick's clothing given under my hands. These

and memory, thank be given to God calling to mind my temporal
goods do make and ordain this my last will and testament, such
as touching such worldly estate wherewith it has pleased God to
bless me in this life. I give, devise and dispose of the same in this following
manner that is to say. First I give and bequeath to Martha Martin my
wife one mare named Prancer. One side horse two hundred and thirty two
pounds and furniture. I also lend her one negro woman named Anne
her life or widowhood, and also the use of the plantation her life or
widowhood and my hope that is now Francis and my field to
support the stock and family, give blessed the house hold furniture are
also to remain for her use also I leave her one negro girl named
Mason her widowhood. Second I also give to my son Francis
Martin two notes of against Robert Marshall amounting to Eighty Eight
dollars and thirty cents, including the interest, and also the half of a
stage coach named Arch. Thirdly I also give to my son
Marshall one half of the above negro, Arch one bed and furniture
fifty acres of land, the north side of Wally place, and also the
passion track of land. Fourthly I also give unto my grandson
Samuel Johnson one mare, but she bed and furniture one hundred
and fifty one bush and fifty one acres by named Arch and one hundred
and thirty acres of land, but I let of Richard eleven. Fifthly also
I give Thomas Martin one negro man named Arch and one
negro boy named Moses. Sixthly also I give to my son John
Martin children Wm Lucenna James Agassaw Martha John
Martin one note of land given by Richard
Lawrence to Marshall Martin, I also give to John Johnson Francis
Wally that he is owing thirty to me in money. Seventhly
also I give my son Samuel Martin one negro man named
Arch and John John, one half of his blood that may be sold
Eightly also I give my daughter Martha Martha and
my named Francis. Ninthly also I give my grandson John
