Blayd Blifton's Will. In the name of God Amen I
Blayd Blifton of Nathampton County and State of North Carolina being
at present very sick and weak of body but of perfect sound mind
and memory thanks be to God therefor but calling to mind the
Mortality of my body do constitute and ordain this my last Will
and Testament in manner and form following that is to say first
and principally I commit my Soul into the hands of God
hoping to have free and full pardon of all my sins through
the suffering of my blessed Saviour and to inherit everlasting
life, and as to my body I commit to the ground from
where

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where it was taken to be buried in a christianlike decent manner
at the discretion of my executors hereafter named and as touching
all such temporal estates as it hath pleased almighty God to
bestow upon me I give and dispose thereof as followeth. - First
I would that all my actual debts be paid and discharged. -

Then I give and bequeath unto my two Sisters Lydia Blifton and
Hannah Blifton & my cousin Dorsey, all my Land & plantation wherein
I now live as long as they live single or keep a good orderly house
as I have done, if they do not I give it all to my Brother Ben-
jamin Blifton.

Then I give to my Sister Hannah one Cor. - Then I give & bequeath
to my cousin Dorsey one Cor. - Then I give & bequeath to my
brother Benjamin one Cor. - Then I give all my hogs to my
Sister Hannah & my Sister Lydia and my Cousin Dorsey with
care except one sord and pigs I give to my Brother Benjamin
Blifton. - Then I give one Bum Hoghead to my two Sisters,
Lydia, Hannah and my cousin Dorsey. - I leave my horse
saddle and bridle by the name of Buck to be sold to pay my
part debts and one good feather Bed likewise six head of sheep
and all my Lises I leave to be sold with good care. - Then I
give to my Brother in law Mallicki Randolph fifteen dollars
for making my Coffin, and leave two dollars to Robert
Merritt to preach my funeral Sermon; - Then I give and
bequeath to my brother in law Mallicki Randolph five Barrels of
Corn or ten dollars - All the residue and remainder of my
estate within doors and without I leave to be sold and the
money equally divided among my Sister Hannah, my Sister Lydia
my Cousin Dorsey and my brother Benjamin. - And I do nominate
and appoint my brother Benjamin Blifton my sole & sole
executor of this my last Will & Testament revoking disannulling
& making void all other Wills made by me in
writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
26th day of July 1806

Sealey Parker's Will. Now in the name of Almighty God Amen Sealey Parker of Northampton County and State of N.C. Carolina son now very sick and weak of body but am possessed of sound & disposing mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God. therefore calling to mind that it is appointed for all people once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following form and manner, to wit, I give and bequeath to my only child and son Arminstead one half of the estate and amount of all my goods and chattels after being sold severally and individually. - I then, I give and bequeath to my sister Chorke Griggard fifty dollars of the second half to have and to hold forever. - I then, I give and bequeath to my brother Hulon Griggard all the balance of the second half (after all my just debts are fully paid) and sister Chorke Griggard receives her fifty dollars) to him & his heirs forever. - I then, I do appoint and will that Hulon Griggard be guardian for my son Arminstead believing that he is not capable of being his own guardian. - I do nominate and appoint Hulon Griggard my whole and sole executor in my last Will revoking all other Wills heretofore by me made. I then it is my will and desire that my just debts and funeral charges be paid by my executors hereafter named. I then I and my loving wife Annella Lassiter the use of the Land and plantation whereon I now live during her natural life or widowhood and after her death or marriage. I give and bequeath said land and plantation to my two sons Radrick & William Lassiter to be equally divided between them share and share alike, to them and their heirs forever. - I then I have all the rest of my property of every kind in the case of my said wife to raise my children on, and after they all arrive to lawful age to be equally divided amongst my seven daughters (viz) Elizabeth, Parthena, Martha, Delila, Mary, Mildred, & Lucilla Lassiter to them and their heirs forever. - I nominate and appoint Eliot Trustall to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 31st day of October 1815 -
