I give and bequeath to my daughter Rosetta Snipes one cow and calf to her and her heirs forever. I give and bequeath the Land left to my wife at her death in equal division between my above named sons to they and their heirs forever. The balance of the property left to my wife at her death or marriage I bequeath in equal division between my above named daughters to they and their heirs forever. I hereby constitute and appoint my sonin law and son Braxton Executor to this my last will and testament as witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written
