where I now live during her life also I send the following negroes
namely to wit one nego man by the name of Roger also Nancy
wife & one girl by the name of Nancy also one man by the
name of Colomby also ten head of cattle & two sons dogs and
head, head of fat hogs & also all the household & kitchen furniture
half my Crop if all kinds - Then I give unto my son Thomas
Manh a tract of land lying west side of the mill cut swamp.
& also 25 acres of land that I have left to my wife after her
death joining the mill & also the negroes by the names of End Edon
& Amy & Frank & also 2 head of horses & also all the rest of my
stocks of all kinds to him & his heirs forever. Then I give unto
my grand son Odricke Johnson thirty more acres of Land a young
Charl. Jenkins land and others to him and his heirs forever
Then I give one negro girl unto my grand son Samuel Johnson
to him and his heirs forever. Then I give unto my daughter
Elizabeth Lafater one nego woman by the name of Sally & all her
children that she has now in prospect to his and her heirs forever
Then I give unto my beloved wife Charoty Mann one nego
girl by the name of Soddy to her and her heirs forever
Then my will and desire is that all the negroes that I leave to my
wife shall be equally divided between my son Thomas Mann
and my grand children to wit David, Eliza John Bryant
Elizabeth and Nancy Johnsons after the deceas of my wife also
all the remaining part of my property that I heat before to be
equally divided between the above mentioned children after my
wifes deceas to them and their heirs forever

I do hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Elliot Fitchell
& Jacobus Martin my sole and only Executors to the my last
will and testament desancting all others named in the preceding

Charles Cromp's Will. In the name of god
I Charles Cromp of Northampton County & state of North
Carolina being of sound mind do make this my last will and
testament as follows Test. 1st I give & bequeath unto my wife
Mary Fitchell one sixth of the value of my estate, during her
life & after her death it is my desire that her part of my estate
should be equally divided amongst my children except my
landed estate which is to be distributed equally amongst my
sons (3rdly) It is my desire that after my wife Mary has
taken her sixth of my estate that the balance should be equally
divided amongst my children, except my lands, which is
to be divided equally amongst my sons (3rdly) It is further
my request that my daughter Mary Eliza Cromp should share
no part of my landed estate on account of which I gave &
bequeath unto fourt one negro woman named Nelly & her
future increase over and above her share of my execid
1/6th I do hereby ordain my worthy friends James Fitchell & Richard
Cromp Executors to this my last will and testament. In witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed my seal to
this my last will & testament this eighteenth of January One
thousand eight hundred and Seventeen

Gincy Brantley's Will. In the name of god amen I Gincy Brantley of Northampton County N.C. Carolina being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto god calling unto mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men one to die do make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul unto the hand of Almighty god that gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executor and at touching my worldly estate wherewith I have pleased God to bless me in this life I give, devise, and dispose of the same in the following manner and form-

I give unto my son Ethelred Brantley two negro Boys Hank and Peter and if he die without a lawful issue to return to my other children - Item I give unto my son William Brantley one negro boy John at his coming of age or marrying - Item I give unto my daughter Priscilla Brantley one negro girl Jenny and her increase at her coming of lawful age or marrying and should she die without a lawful issue of her body begotten then the above negro Jenny and her increase to be equally divided amongst William Gincy Rebecca Brantley - Item I give unto Gincy A Brantley my daughter one negro girl Mary and her increase at her coming of lawful age or marrying and should she die without a lawful issue of her body by then the above negro and her increase to be divided between Priscilla, William and Rebecca Brantley - Item I give unto my daughter Rebecca Brantley one negro girl Lydia and her increase at her coming of lawful age or marrying and should she die without a lawful issue of her body together to return to Priscilla, William and Gincy A Brantley - Item I have my two old negroes

Sam and Lydia to make their own choice which of my children Parcellor William Gincy A and Rebecca Brantley they will live with as my wish is for them both to go together - The balance of my property not named after paying all my just debts to be equally divided between Priscilla William Gincy A and Rebecca Brantley when Rebecca becomes of lawful age for marriage - My wish is that this negro which will be named out to choose their own home as it is my wish for them not to be intermixed - Likewise affiant James H Wood my sole Executor to this my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this thirtieth day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and Twenty six

I Deborah Boon of the County of Bathampton and State of North Carolina do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following to wit First I give unto my grandson Archibald Boon Smith all the land wherein I now live also one negro girl named Cely also a boy by the name of Roselot my daughter Linda Smith has the use of the land and Cely until the Boon Smith is twenty one years of age to him and his heirs forever - Second I give unto my grand son Samuel Mathews Welsh Fletcher Smith one negro girl by the name of Remmy also one Cow heifer also one mare to him and his heirs forever Thirdly I give unto my grand daughter Deborah Elizabeth Smith one negro woman named Agg also one negro child named Dicy also one palfrey also one Cow also one Mare also one Chick to her and her heirs forever - Fourthly I give unto my daughter Anna Fletcher the wife of Brester Fletcher one negro woman named Remmy also one negro girl named Martha also one Bed furnished with said Brester Fletcher will pay my grand son Archibald Boon Smith one hundred and fifty Dollars to her and her heirs forever
