I give her likewise the bed and furniture wherein she and I commonly lie three Setting chairs 1 dining table with a Down half a dozen chairs & two half dozen Spoons 1 Piecrust pot which we now cook in one Small iron pot & kettle chard & Piping Table one dark brindled Cow 1 spotted Sow and pig & one year provision out my Stock of Corn and pork now on hand in my will and desire is that after the death or marriage of my wife Christian Daniel the above named property which I have given unto her be called together by my executors and sold at public auction and the money arising from the sale of the same be equally divided between my daughters Martha H Daniel and Rebecca H Daniel to them and their heirs forever. Item 2nd my will and desire is that my other tract of lands together with all the cattle of my estate not above named be sold and the money arising from the sale of the same be appropriated to the payment of all my just debts and the remainder whatever it may be equally divided between my two daughters Anne Daniel & Martha H Daniel and Rebecca H Daniel to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I nominate and appoint my wife Christian Daniel the sole executrix to this my last will and testament revoking all other wills or testaments before made by me in any wise whatsoever for witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 12th day of February 1824

Secondly I give unto Sally Pabell Gloucier four negroes by name Lucy Mary John and Washington to her and his heirs forever Thirdly I give unto John Gloucier three negroes by name Nancy Sparrow and Cardis to him and his heirs forever. Fourthly It is my will and desire that John Gloucier should keep the above negroes and not suffer them to be hired out and to let them have time as they come of age or marry Fifthly it is my will and desire that my land that I bought of Weston Davis 25 $\frac{1}{2}$ acres with all my household goods and furniture also all my kitchen furniture all my stock of horses cattle hogs and sheep and plantation tools wagons carts plow to sold and money in savings paid and said with all the money that is enough & equally divided between my Sister Sarah Sons Dennis Ham and John Gloucier also it is my will and desire John Gloucier should give unto Eddy Adams Yearly what he may think proper to support her out of the above property that is sold to them and their heirs forever And I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend John Gloucier Executor of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Mary Pabell have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above mentioned sealed published and declared by the said Mary Pabell the Testator as her last will and Testament in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing thereof
