Ordered that said Will and Codicil be certified & recorded.

Nathaniel Edwards son's Will. In the name of God, Amen I Nathaniel Edwards son of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in my body but in my perfect senses and memory, knowing that it is appointed for all men to die, make this my last Will and Testament. I constitute my son Nathaniel Edwards to sell a certain parcel of my negroes to discharge a debt due William Amis, namely, Lewis, Adam, Dick, Hannah, Alfred, Betty, Winney, Matt, Jim, Carr, Betty, they do not. I give unto my beloved wife Martha Edwards a negro woman named Pate and a negro girl named Elyas; I give unto my son Nathaniel Edwards a certain negro man named Charles & his boys Willie & Nelson. I give unto my son John Edwards a negro man named Adam and a boy Stephen. I give unto my son Francis Edwards a negro boy named Davy. I give unto my daughter Mary Popson two girls Abel & Rachel. I give unto my daughter Martha Edwards a negro girl named Moriah and a boy Holladay. I give unto my daughter Susan Ann Edwards a negro man Jacob & a boy Allen & a woman Lucy. I devise that my tract of land lying on the South side of Turkey Creek to be sold together with my stock household and kitchen furniture for the purpose of discharging my just debts. I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend James Mangor and my son Nathaniel Edwards Executors of this my last Will and Testament in witness whereof I the said Nathaniel Edwards seal here to this my last Will and Testament at my hand and seal this third day

day of May eighteen hundred & fourteen

Benjamin Doles's Will. In the name of God Amen I Benjamin Doles of the County of Southampton being of sound memory and understanding be weak in body do constitute this my last Will and Testament. I recommend my soul to the Almighty God to take it to himself and my body to the earth there to be decently buried as my executors shall think best, and as to my worldly estate I desire that it may be divided amongst my brothers and sisters namely Jesse Doles, Willis Doley, Elizabeth, Allen and Eum Doles as follows, vizt I give and bequeath one negro woman named Abeyan and her increase which was left to me by my grand father Arthur Hollamow who lived in Northampton County North Carolina and also all the rest of the property be it of what nature or kind it may be left me by the above mentioned Arthur Hollamow. I also give one boy called named Damon to the above named brothers and sisters, to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever. I also do constitute and appoint my brother Jesse Doles and Willis Doles my whole and sole executors of this my last Will and Testament, and in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this first day of November in the year of our Lord 1800 -

Also Court held for the County of Southampton the 17th day of August 1801 this Will was presented on behalf by Willis Dotes one of the executors therein named (the other refusing) proved by the oaths of John Cigures and Willis Stephenson the witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the motion of the said Will who made ^{oath} according to law probate is granted him on giving bond and security, whereupon the said Willis Dotes with Jacob Turner and Willis Stephenson his securities entered into and acknowledged their bond in the penalty of two thousand dollars for the said Willis's due and faithful performance of the said decedent's Will and administration on his estate.

Elizabeth Bridgers Will. In the name of God Amen, I Elizabeth Bridger relict of James Bridger decd of the County of Southampton and State of South Carolina being in perfect health in body and of sound and perfect mind and memory do make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following viz: I send unto my daughter Tabitha Bridger all my property that I may or shall be possessed with or entitled to at my decease to her and her heirs lawfully begotten of her body during the life of the aforesaid Tabitha Bridger and also during the life of the said Tabitha Bridgers heirs. Deut of the said Tabitha Bridger aforesaid de without having a lawful heir or heirs as mentioned aforesaid, then I bequeath my property as follows —

Item I give unto James Bridger son of Josiah Bridger one negro girl named Annica, also one feather bed & furniture, to him and his heirs forever. — Also my will and desire is that after all my just debts is satisfied and finally adjusted that all the remaining part of my property which I have not already given away, shall be equally divided between Helen Gizzard, Phoebe Gizzard, Seclah Carter and Mary Mungar. — also including Dolly Sulley, Charlotte Williams and Nancy Williams daughters of Robert Williams decd to receive as a legatee ~~the same~~ with the other four legates above mentioned to them and their heirs forever, except the part of my property that Mary Mungar is entitled to, that part of property my will and desire is at the said Mary Mungars death for her part to descend and be equally divided between the other four mentioned legates as above stated, including the three daughters of Robert Williams above mentioned as one legatee. And I do hereby appoint Helen Gizzard my sole executor of this my last Will and Testament, hereby revoking all former Wills by me made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 16 day of December in the year of our Lord 1812 — her
