In the name of God Amen I Thomas Rivers of Northampton County state of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory blessed be God for the same do this 30th day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand and eight hundred and sixteen make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following this is to say: Item 1st my will and desire is my executor whom I shall hereafter appoint shall pay all my just debts. Item 2nd my will and desire is that my executor purchase a negro woman named Judy now the property of Benja Sykes which I sold him and emancipate her for meritorious services after the death or widowhood of my sister Winnifred G. Blow who is to have her during her natural life or widowhood. Item 3rd I leave to my sister Winnifred Blow during her natural life or widowhood all my estate. Item 4th I give and bequeath to my niece Sarah Blow after the death or widowhood of her mother Winnifred Blow all the above estate leaving her mother (except the s^t) Sarah Blow should die before she arrives to the age of twenty one years of leaves a lawful heir of her body in which event my will and desire is that my estate be equally divided among all my brothers and sisters. Lastly I nominate and appoint my worthy friend James T. Sykes my executor of this my last will and testament, in witness whereof I the said Thomas Rivers have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

Northampton December Court 1816 This last will and testament of Thomas Rivers deed was exhibited into Court and proved in due form of law by the oaths of Robert G. Farham John B. Peebles and Andrew H. Walker the subscribing witnesses thereto and was ordered to be recorded: time being allowed the executors therein named to qualify. And at a Court held for the County of Northampton the first Monday in March 1817 James T. Sykes the executor named in the preceding will came into Court & renounced his right of qualifying thereto: whereupon administration of all and singular the goods and chattels rights and credits of the said Thomas Rivers deed is granted to the said James T. Sykes and John Lockhart, who together with Payton Maughan and James Barrett entered into & acknowledged their bond in the penalty of four thousand dollars, conditioned as the law direct:

Septe Dole's Will. In the name of God Amen I Sepe Dole of No. 14 camp in County and state of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory (blessed be God) do this fifteenth day of February in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and seventeen make and publish this my last will and testament in manner following that is to say. First I give and bequeath unto Littleberry Long my black mare called Nancy Bettle. Item I give and bequeath unto Polly Long daughter of John Long one negro woman called Mima to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my brother Wilkes Dole's two oldest children namely Willkins Dole and Wilks Dole each twenty five dollars a piece. Item I give and bequeath unto my brother Willie Dole's two children namely Denmark Dole and Joe Dole each twenty five dollars a piece. Item I give and bequeath unto my brother Epsom Dole's two children namely Arthur James Dole and Sally Dole twenty five dollars each or apiece. It is my will and desire that all my estate not hereby first given away should be sold at public action on a credit of twelve months by my executors whom I appoint and after paying all my just debts I desire that my whole estate that I have not given away above should be equally divided between the above eight children namely Littleberry Long Polly Long Willkins Dole Wilks Dole Denmark Dole Joe Dole Arthur James Dole and Sally Dole and my will is if either of the aforementioned children should die without a lawful heir the surviving ones should heir his or her estate, and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friends Epsom Hallamon just and my nephew Littleberry Long executors of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof I the said Sepe Dole have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day and year first above written.

Baykin two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and was ordered to be recorded: whereupon Epsom Hallamon just and Littleberry Long the executors in the said will named came into Court and qualified thereto according to law.
