Ned, Nelly & Nelly, one horse named Jack saddle & bridle, four bales of Cotton & Pittsburgh branded thus W.E. one tract of land containing one hundred thirty seven acres & three fourth acres purchased of Samuel Reavis — likewise one seventh part of my Household furniture stock & negroes that has not been given by legacies before to him of his heirs forever. And I do hereby constitute my son Sugar Edwards & Mark Edwards my whole & sole executors of this my last Will & Testament, and I do hereby disannul revoke and make and all former wills hereinafter to be made or spoken. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this fifteenth day of February in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and eleven and of American Independence the thirty fifth —

Mark Edwards's Will.

I the name of God. Amen; I Mark Edwards of Northampton County N.C. being sickly weak but in perfect sense of memory thanks be given to God for the same, but knowing that there is an approaching time for all men once to die, and knowing how uncertain the time is. I do make this my last Will & Testament viz I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my body to the earth to be decently buried. And as for what worldly goods it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me with I give and bequeath as follows to wit that is to say my debt and funeral expences be first paid and discharged, then as for the remainder part of my estate I give and bequeath as follows to wit I give and bequeath unto my dear Mother Mary Anne Edwards one Acre named Brundapart a quantity of Books wearing Apparel &c likewise one seventh part of the household furniture stock and negroes also one fifth part of the land that that has not been given in my Father's last Will to you and your heirs forever after paying my Father's estate \$126 I also give my Mother one negro Boy named Moses to her of her heirs forever. I do hereby disannul revoke and make void all former Will heretofore made or spoken. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred & eleven —
