disposing mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God therfor.
calling to mind that it is appointed for all people once to die so
make and ordain this my last will and testament in the following
form and manner, to wit, Item I give and bequeath to my only
child and son Amistead one half of the value and amount
of all my goods and chattels after being sold severally and
individually. - Item, I give and bequeath to my sister Thorbe
Grizzard fifty dollars of the second half to have and to hold
forever. - Item, I give and bequeath to my brother Hulon C.
Grizzard all the balance of the second half (after all my
just debts are fully paid) and Sister Thorbe Grizzard receives
her fifty dollars to him & his heirs forever. - Item, I do appoint
and will that Hulon Grizzard be guardian for my son C.
Amistead believing that he is not capable of being his own
guardian. I do nominate and appoint Hulon Grizzard
my whole and sole executor in my last Will revoking all other Wills
heretofore by me made. Witness whereof I have affixed my seal this 17th

Green Lepiter's Will. In the name of God Amen I Green
Lepiter of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being at this time
very weak in body but of a sound mind and memory thanks be to
God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and
knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die, as for all the worldly
goods as it hath pleased God to bestow me with, I give in the following
manner and form, Item It is my will and desire that my just
debts and funeral charges be paid by my executors here after named.
Item I bequeath my living wife Drucilla Lepiter the use of the land and
plantation whereto I now live during her natural life or widow-
hood and after her death or marriage I give and bequeath
said land and plantation to my two sons Reddick & William
Lepiter to be equally divided between them share and share alike,
to them and their heirs forever. - Item I leave all the rest of my
property of every kind in the care of my said wife to raise my
children on, and after they all arrive to lawful age to be equally
divided amongst my seven daughters viz, Elizabeth, Parthena,
Martha, Della, Abby, Mildred, & Drucilla Lepiter to them
and their heirs forever. - I nominate and appoint Eliot Fitchell
to this my last Will and Testament, In witness whereof I have
hereunto set my hand and seal this 31 day of October 1813. -

Mary Ann Edwards' Will. In the name of God Amen I Mary
Ann Edwards of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina
being sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God almighty
8th day of December one thousand eight hundred and thirteen

in the year of our Lord make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that it to say - First. I give and bequeath to my beloved son John M. Edwards one half of all my Lands, one negro man named Sam, one Bed of furniture, twenty Bushels Corn five hundred pounds pork, two cows and calves, one sow and pigs to have and to hold forever. - Item I give to my son Ruth Edwards one fourth part of land and one negro girl Judith to have and to hold forever. - Item I give to my son William B. Edwards one fourth part of my Land and one negro man Jim, and one other named Tom not to have & to hold forever. Item, I give to my son Alexander T. Edwards one negro boy named Oliver one negro girl named Eliza to have and hold forever. - Item I give to my son George Edwards two hundred Dollars to have and to hold forever, and all my stock crop and plantation utensils to be sold and all my debts to be paid. - And I hereby make and ordain my sons Ruth Edwards and William B. Edwards executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said Mary Ann Edwards have to this my last Will & Testament set my hand and seal the day and year above written.

I James Larister son of the County of Northampton and State of No^r Carolina in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred fours call to mind the mortality of the body being in perfect health and of sound mind and memory knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain my last Will and Testament in manner following viz principally and first of all I recommend my Soul unto the hands of Almighty God and my body to be buried in a decent Christian like form and at lengthing my mortall estate I give and devise and dispose in the following way: First I give and bequeath unto my living sons Shadrack Larister, Elias Larister, Elijah Larister, and Green Larister and my living daughter Deborah Williams to each of them the sum of five shillings to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my loving son James Larister such a part of my Land as I shall lay off for him hereafter, also one feather bed & furniture, also one cow and Calf, also one ewe and lamb also one sow and pigs to him & his heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath unto my living son Jonathan Larister such a part of my Land as I shall lay off for him hereafter also one feather bed & furniture to him and his heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath unto my living son Jordan Larister such a part of my Land as I shall lay off for him hereafter, also one feather bed & furniture to him and his heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath unto my living wife Lydia Larister one feather bed and furniture also my riding beast, also two Cows and Calves also two ewes and lambs also one sow and pigs to her & her heirs forever. - Item I bequeath to my living wife Lydia Larister the whole of personal estate (not yet given) within and without doors and every article of all kind until my three youngest daughters namely Honora Larister Abigail Larister and Reinaford both come of age and after the three last mentioned children come of age I give the whole of my estate not yet given to be equally divided between them my three youngest daughters to them and their heirs forever and likewise I constitute and appoint my truly friend Eliot Butall the whole and sole of my executors of this my last Will & Testament, and do confirm this to be my last Will & Testament to witness whereof I have set my hand & affixed my seal this day and year first above written -
