Ellis of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina, being weak of body but of sound and perfect mind and memory do... constitute make and ordain this my last Will & Testament, I give and dispose of my estate in manner and form following, I lend unto my loving wife Priscilla Ellis all of my estate of every kind during her widowhood or until my son Robert comes to the age of twenty one years, and then my will and desire that all my estate be equally divided between my wife and three children Robert, Daniel and Caroline delated Ellis, to them their heirs and assigns forever. I constitute & appoint my wife Priscilla Ellis sole executor to this my last will & Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 14th November 1814

Willie Boddie's Will. In the name of God Amen. I Willie Boddie of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina, being in my perfect senses, do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, to wit, First, I lend unto my wife Jane during her natural life time all my tract of land lying on Bridger's Creek in the County of Northampton wherein I now live, together with all my stock of horses hogs, cattle and sheep, household & kitchen furniture (one bed furniture excepted) plantation utensils &c. I also lend unto my wife Jane during her natural life time all my negroes, except such as may be hereafter otherwise disposed of - Secondly, I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Maria Anne, Caroline Boddie Lawrence, after the death of my wife Jane, one half of the tract of land wherein I now live, lying on Bridger's Creek, to her and her heirs and assigns forever. I also give and bequeath

133 bequeath unto my said grand daughter Maria Anne Caroline Boddie Lawrence, the following negro to wit Epeo, Bill, Vickie Mary and Cain to her her heirs and assigns forever - Thirdly, I give and bequeath unto my son Willie H. Boddie one good feather Bed Furniture, to him his heirs & assigns forever - Fourthly, I lend unto my son Willie H. Boddie (for the benefit of my daughter Sabina Lawrence during her natural life time) after the decease of my wife Jane the remaining half of the tract of land wherein I now live; and after the death of any said daughter Sabina Lawrence I give and bequeath the said land to my grand daughter Maria Anne Caroline Boddie Lawrence, to her and her heirs forever - Fifthly, I give and bequeath unto my grand daughter Martha Vickie Lawrence two negroes, Lewis, Lucia and Philip, to her, her heirs and assigns forever.

Sixthly, It is my will and desire that after the death of my wife Jane, all the property lent her except that here before bequeathed be equally divided among all the children which my daughter Sabina Lawrence may leave at the time of her death (except my grand daughters Maria Anne Caroline Boddie Lawrence) to them their heirs and assigns forever -

Lastly, I nominate and appoint my son Willie H. Boddie sole executor of this my last Will & Testament, as well as guardian for the children of my daughter Sabina Lawrence mentioned in the foregoing Will. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 14th day of November 1814.
