

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lucy Sanbford one negro woman named Sadah and all her increase to she & her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Polly Soyner one negro girl by the name of Dorcas to she and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rebecca Peger one negro boy by name of Terry, to she and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Meriam Woodard two negro boys by the names of Bugger and Tom to she and her heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Charity Davis five pounds to she and her heirs forever.

Item My will and devise is that my negro woman named Milly and her increase to be sold at public sale and the money arising from the sale of said negro to remain in the hands of my executor hereafter named and for him to give my daughter Charity twenty five dollars a year till he gives her three hundred dollars.

Item My will and devise is that all my property not before mentioned shall be sold at public sale and the money arising from the sale thereof to pay the balance of the negro woman before mentioned should not sell for enough to raise three hundred dollars and also for my executor to pay all my just debts and the balance after all is discharged to be equally divided between four of my daughters to wit Lucy Sanbford, Polly Soyner, Rebecca Peger and Meriam Woodard to them & their heirs forever.

I do nominate and appoint my son Benjamin Boon & Elliot Tuttle my two executors to the above mentioned testament and do hereby disannul all other wills heretofore made by me: whereas I do hereby set my hand and affix my seal this 26th day of March 1815.

Herod Faison's Will. In the name of God Amen I Herod Faison do, of the County of Northampton & State of North Carolina being of sound mind and disposing memory blessed be God

do make and devise this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth to wit First I give & bequeath unto my son Britton Faison one certain tract of land lying on the south side of Longroy Swamp containing one hundred and fifty acres being the land whereon he now lives, and one hundred and twenty five and a half acres of land being the land whereon South Parish formerly lived, together with one hundred acres of land lying on the old road it being the land I bought of Durwell Hanger, to him and his heirs forever; also I give unto my son Britton Faison one several horse Richard's two cows and calves one feather bed and furniture together with all and singular his household and kitchen furniture now in his possession.

Second I give and bequeath unto my son Herod Faison one certain tract of land containing two hundred and fifty seven acres it being the land I purchased of Jobe Slays and one certain tract of land I bought of James Peeler containing seventy acres to the same more or less, together with one several horse it being the horse I bought of Brooch Basses and one bridle and saddle two cows and calves two sows and twenty two pigs sixteen hogs one year old one hundred and fifty barrels of corn one bed & furniture one dish and six plates to him and his heirs forever.

Third I lend unto beloved wife Sarah Faison the land & plantation whereon Snow live containing two hundred and sixty seven acres together with a certain tract of land I bought of John Hanger containing one hundred acres during her life or widowhood, except one half of my young orchard on said plantation, whereas I wish my son Herod Faison to have one half of said orchard in possession and to be divided as the path runs through the orchard by my dwelling house. I further lend unto my wife Sarah Faison one negro man named Stephen one negro woman named Charlotte one negro girl named Slick one negro boy named Mariday together with three cows and calves two feather beds and furniture two head of horns one known by the name of Slick the other known by the name of the Packs horse one riding chair and harness fifty barrels of corn one chest one trunk two pots one large earthen dish one pewter dish seven pewter plates one pewter basin one large flowered punch bowl two sows and sixteen pigs and twelve year old hogs six sitting chairs for the support and maintenance of herself during her natural life or widowhood.

Fourth I give and bequeath unto my son Henry Faison one negro man named Tony and one negro boy named Daniel one stud horse known by the name of the Arab with eight head of cattle one bay mare and trap filly one bed and furniture together with all and singular his household and kitchen furniture to him & his heirs forever.

Fifth I lend unto my daughter Frances Faison one negro woman named Nelson one negro woman named Hager and one negro man named Solomon I further lend unto my daughter Frances one feather bed and furniture one large trunk one pewter chest and basin & six plates, whereas my wish and devise is that my son Britton Faison & Herod Faison should and support her the said Frances Faison and keep her negro woman with her to wait & attend on her and to pay themselves out

of the hire of her negroes, but in case said Frances should marry & have an heir or heirs lawfully begotten of her body my wish and desire is that all the property so lent should descend unto said heir or heirs to them & their heirs forever: but after the death of said Frances Faison in case she should die without lawful issue my wish is that said property should be equally divided between my other four children namely Henry Faison, Britton Faison Herod Faison and Patsy M. Faison to them and their heirs forever.

Sixth. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Patsy M. Faison one negro boy named Nat and one negro girl named Betty two cows and calves one feather bed and furniture one small trunk one powder dish and basin & six plates one woman's saddle to her and her heirs forever.

Seventh. After the death or marriage of my wife I give unto my son Herod Faison all and singular the lands and plantation lent unto my wife containing three hundred and sixty seven acres to him and his heirs forever.

Eighth. After the death or marriage of my wife my wish and desire is that all the property lent unto her should be equally divided between my five children namely Henry Faison Britton Faison Herod Faison and Patsy M. Faison to them & their heirs forever.

Ninth. The balance of my property not given away nor lent consisting of negroes together with all and singular my stock of whatsoever kind I am possessed with I intend should be equally divided between

namely Henry Faison Britton Faison Herod Faison and Patsy M. Faison to them & their heirs forever.

Tenth. I do hereby constitute and appoint my three sons namely Henry Faison Britton Faison and Herod Faison who are sole executives to this my last Will & Testament. In witness whereof I have unto set my hand and seal this 20th day of September A. D. one thousand eight hundred & fifteen.

Jacob Dupree's Will. In the name of God Amen I Jacob Dupree of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being of a sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as follows:—Item, I give to my daughter Amy Phada and Henry Lewis all my lands except fifty acres adjoining the lands of Ann Roper (which fifty acres is to be allotted and laid off in the most convenient manner) I also give to my said daughter all my crop of corn and stock of hogs to them their heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give to my daughter Annie one negro boy named Holland one choice horse one cow and calf one bed & furniture and one third part of all my powder to her her heirs and assigns forever.

Item. I give to my daughter Phada one negro girl named Hannah one second choice horse one cow and calf one bed and furniture and one third part of all my powder to her her heirs & assigns forever.

Item. I give to my daughter Mary Lewis one negro woman named Abba and child Sackey and three future increase one third choice horse one cow and calf one bed and furniture and one third part of all my powder to her her heirs & assigns forever.

Item. I give to my grand daughter Corabella Dupree the fifty acres of land above recited to be taken off that part of my land adjoining the lands of Ann Roper, but provided my said grand daughter should die without lawful issue, I then give the said fifty acres of land to the whole of my children to them their heirs & assigns forever.

Item. I give to my grand son Benjamin Hall one negro boy named Abel one second horse one bed and furniture and one cow & calf to him his heirs & assigns forever.

Item. I give to my grand son James Hall one bed and furniture one cow and calf to him his heirs and assigns forever.

Item. My will and desire is that my negro man Roger shall have the privilege of choosing either of my children for his owner, and what ever he may make choice of I give him the said Roger to be him or her his or her heirs & assigns forever.

Item. My will and desire is that all the residue of my estate not above mentioned shall be equally divided between my son James and my daughters Annie Phada and Mary Lewis to them their heirs & assigns forever. I do hereby nominate and appoint my daughter Annie Dupree and Lewis Dupree executives and executors of this my last Will and Testament, In testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my hand & seal this 21st day of May 1815.
