Plantations situated, my Stock of every kind, with one Negro slave to wit, and at the death of my wife I give the seventy Acres of Land which I leave to my wife to my son William Buffalaw to be sold at the death of my wife I leave to be sold and equally divided among my four daughters, namely, Josephine, Lucy, Martha & Mary Buffalaw all to Regulate the property not given away. — I give to my daughter Josephine one parcel of furniture I give to my daughter Lucy one bed & furniture. I give to my daughter Mary one bed & furniture to have their share & I give the only last land lying in Sampson County N. Carolina I give one half to my son William Buffalaw according to our previous agreement the other half I leave to my four children to be equally divided, namely, William, Josephine, Lucy, Martha & Mary. — I leave my wife one hundred dollars. — I leave & appoint my son William Buffalaw sole Executor of this my last Will and Testament. I do hereby revoke & disannul all & every other former testaments, In Witness my hand & Seal this 1st day of June 1830.

 cow and calf two feather beds and furniture also one horse and
 cart to him his heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my two daughters Sally Pittell and Mary Talbot one
 negro woman by the name of Anne to be equally divided between
 them to them and their heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my daughter Sally Pittell one horse and cart one cow
 and calf two feather beds and furniture and one horse and saddle
 to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my
 daughter Mary Talbot one cow and calf two feather beds and
 furniture which she has in her possession one horse and saddle and
 one calf and the other half goes down free to her and her heirs
 forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my two sons Edwin Pittell
 and Bullin Pittell and Sally Pittell and Mary Talbot all the
 residue of my property not before mentioned to them and their
 heirs forever. I do nominate and appoint my son Bullin
 Pittell my whole and sole Executor to this my last will and
 Testament discharging and releasing all other wills or wills
 heretofore by me made in which these bequests are my

 portion of my Estate — Item 2nd I give and bequeath to William
 Pope one negro girl named Caroline and her future increase
 to him his heirs & assigns forever any thing to the contrary in this will
 notwithstanding. Item 3rd I give and bequeath unto Richard D. Maclean
 one negro man named Adam to him his heirs & assigns forever any thing
 in this will to the contrary notwithstanding.

Item 4th It is my will and desire that all my land and furniture, plate China
 and glass ware and pictures be equally divided, according to the
 valuation between my said three nephews to them and their heirs
 and assigns forever. Item 5th It is my will and desire that my
 stock of all kinds working tools hogs on hand and the balance
 of my furniture be sold and also every part or parcel of my
 property which may be found at my death except my land
 and land except such as is therein disposed of shall be
