### Jamerson Futrell's Will.

In the name of God Amen I Jamerson Futrell of the County of  
Northampton and State of North Carolina, being sick and weak in  
body, but in sound sense and disposing memory of mind do  
make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner  
and form following:-

Item, My will and desire is that all my just debts be paid.

Item, I leave unto my beloved wife Saby Futrell one horse  
bridle and saddle, one saw and Gasp one saw and Pig also

one feather bed and furn chure, also one wooden wheel, also one linnen wheel  
also one pot, also one pan, also one skillet, also one half dozen of Pewter  
plates, also one dish, also half dozen of ~~cray~~, also one table, also one  
chest, also one ax and wedging hoe, also one saw and gear, also one  
tub and paul, also half dozen earthen plates also one third of the crop  
now growing and after her marraige or death shal be equal divided  
betwixt my said Children Jaron Futrell, John Futrell, Lewis  
Futrell, Malchiah Futrell William Futrell -

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Jaron Futrell, one feather be  
and furniture, also one saw and pigo also one cow and calf also  
one plow hoe & ax also my Cooper tools to him this leen forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son John Futrell one horse colt, also one  
feather bed and furniture, also one ax and wedging hoe & plow hoe  
also one negro boy by the name of Edum to him and his heirs forever  
if he sud die without lawful heir begotten of his body shall descend  
to the rest of his brothers.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my son Lewis Futrell, one horse &  
calf also one feather bed and furniture, also one ax, also one wedging  
hoe also one plow hoe also one gun to him and his heirs forever.

Item, I give and bequeath unto my sons Lewis Futrell and  
Malchiah Futrell and William Futrell Clearcay Vinny and  
her in case after my death to be sold and equal divide and if  
either of them shud die without lawful heir begotten of their  
body, shud descend to the rest of their brethren.

I leave my negro Woman Coby to live with any of my  
family whom she pleases.

My Will and desire is that all the remainder part of my  
property is to be sol and after paying my just debts to be  
divided betwixt Lewis Futrell, Malchiah Futrell and William  
Futrell to them and their heirs forever.

And I constitute and appoint and ordain Willie Futrell my whole  
and soul executor disannulling and revoking all other Wills by  
me heretofore made, as witness my hand and seal this 3<sup>rd</sup> day of  
September 1811

### Silvey Janner's Will.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Hannah Hay one dollar to her & her heirs forever. - Item I give and bequeath to my grandson Bennett Edwards four dollars besides his proportionable part of any property with others as will be mentioned hereafter.

Item, I further my will and desire that all my property may be sold and all my just debts paid and after that the balance equally divided between my son Howell Janner my daughter Elizabeth Janner and my daughter Patsy Janner and my grandson Bennett Edwards to them and their heirs forever.

And I do appoint Frey Balmour my executor of this my last Will and Testament revoking all other Will or Wills heretofore made by me. In witness whereof I have hereunto set

4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my son John Hart one negro boy Abram to him and his heirs forever.

5<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Patsy Hart one negro girl Amy, one bed and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

6<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Jenny Hart
