I Jeremiah Outland of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in body yet in sound memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament this 2nd day of 9th M^r. 1824. — 1st I give and bequeath unto my daughter Lydia Carter all the property which I bought & sent her to her and her heirs and assigns forever. — 2^d I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my son Robert Outland, died William Martha John Edmund & Mary Oakland the land and plantation where time past formerly lived to be equally divided between them to them their heirs and assigns forever — 3rd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel Outland the choice of my beds & furniture also one blue chest one small mast one pair of mill scales one lanning wheel also my stock of tea and all my ~~fisher~~ one cow ~~two~~ two ^{one} coffee mill and one butter pot to her her heirs and assigns forever. — 4th I give and bequeath unto my grandson Edmund Outland the second ^{choice} of my beds to him, his heirs and assigns forever. — 5th I give to negro Priscilla whom I raised one cow & yearling also one ^{small} blue chest & spinning wheel to be her property. — 6th I bear the remainder of my Estate not heretofore given away to be sold. I give one half to my daughter Rachel Outland the other half to be divided between Lydia Carter & Robert Outland & his heirs. — I nominate and appoint William Outland Executor to this my last will and testament.

William Garner Sr.'s Will. In the name of God amen I William Garner of Northampton County State of North Carolina being in the decline of life and weak in body but of sound mind and memory and being possessed with a large portion of this world's goods do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following. Item 1st I give to my son John Garner the land and plantation wherein he has formerly lived one hundred acres more or less known by the name of Braxt Branch. — Item 2nd I give to my daughter Mary Ingram one negro woman by the name of Dary and her six children which she has now in possession also an old woman by the name of Betsy. Item 3rd I give to my daughter Elizabeth Weaver one negro woman named Wining and her five children which she has in possession also one negro a man by the name of Old Chancy and her daughter Cherry. Item 4th I give to my son Samuel Garner the land and plantation wherein he now lives boundary line of said land must commence at the corner of my land & extends on the ~~Branch~~ ^{Branch} thence down the said ~~Branch~~ ^{Branch} to where the line runs between my land & Labor for works land thence along said line to our ~~old~~ ^{old} black Jack on the side of Scott Branch. Hence a straight

Bright line across to where the path that leads from my plantation to Sally Jones's Groves to little dreen so on to the line between my land and Buckers and thence to the beginning above negro man by the name of Kith. — Item 5th I send to my daughter Amy Ferguson the use of one negro woman named Nance during her natural life then I give the said negro woman Anna to my granddaughter Mary Ann Woodruff but the issue of said Nance I crave to equally divided among my daughter Amy's Ferguson Children. — Item 6th I send to my daughter Anna atwood the use of one negro woman by the name of Portugal so his daughter Mary also has daughter Lucy during her natural life and at her death if she leaves a lawful heir or heirs lawful by legation of her body I crave that they should have them, but if she dies without having any other child but her daughter Maria I give the said negroes to her. — Item 7th I send to my daughter Frances Malhole the use of one negro man by the name of Lamar also one negro woman by the name of Susan which she has in her possession also one negro boy by the name of Sam and at her death I give the said negroes to be equally divided among her children. — Item the 8th I send to Richard Garner, one negro man by the name of Isaac, also one by the name of Gulford which he has had. — Item 9th I give to my son W^m Garner all the balance of my land that I have not given to my sons John and Samuel also one negro man by the name of Dony also one by the name of Henry also one by the name of Anthony also one by the name of Daniel also one negro woman by the name of Ester and her son Sam also her daughter Sarey also one negro woman by the name of Agg, also one by the name of Sinthy, also her child by the name of Marietta also one negro woman by the name of Young Chancy also her child by the name of Sim also an Old man by the name of Peter. — Item 10th I give to my granddaughter Maria Garner, one negro woman by the name of Rosie, also one negro girl by the name of Wick also one negro boy by the name of Aaron also one feather bed furniture.

Item 11th I give to my granddaughter Mary Ingram daughter of Francis Ingram one hundred Dollars Item 12th I give to my granddaughter Mary Ann Woodruff one negro boy by the name of Stevens — Item 13th I give to my grandchild William Equiano Emilia Eliza & Sally Equiano one negro women by the name of Lucy which their father has in his possession and her first child was one boy by the name of Darner also one girl by the name of Eliza also one girl by the name of Young also one boy by the name of John also one girl by the name of Hannah to be equally divided with my debt Item 14th the remainder of my estate of what kind soever to me appertaining I desire to be equally divided among my living children and lastly I appoint my son John Garner and William Garner whole and sole Executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly revoke disown & disannul all former legatees wills and legacies by me hereof made ratifying and confirming this and no other to my last will and testament in writing whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th day of September eighteen hundred and twenty two
