Item I further my will and desire that all my property may be sold and all my just debts paid and after that the balance equally divided between my son Howell Tannor my daughter Elizabeth Tannor and my daughter Patsy Tannor and my grandson Donnet Edwards to them and their heirs forever. one negro girl Elya and ten dollars to be raised if lived out of my estate to be raised by her and her heirs forever.

7<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Rebecca Hart one negro woman such and her increase hereafter to her & her heirs forever after the death or marriage of my wife.

8<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughters Partheny and Demy Hart one negro woman Alex and her increase one bed and furniture to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever after the death or marriage of my wife.

9<sup>th</sup> I constitute and appoint my son John Hart my whole and sole executor to this my last will and Testament and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Testaments, Wills, legacies, bequests and executors by me in any way before named ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will & Testament. ## Robert Fox's Will.

In the name of God Amen. I Robert Fox a resident of North Carolina Northampton County being of sound and perfect mind and memory (Blessed be God) do this Friday fourth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eleven make and publish this my last Will and Testament in manner following that is to say.

Item 1<sup>st</sup> I lend unto my beloved wife Jemima Fox one third part of the plantation whereon I now live during her natural life to be laid off in manner following. Beginning at the West end of my Tobacco ground at the road and running a North West direction so as to include the Mansion House and take the greatest proportion of the dower in the land purchased of General Allen Jones. I lend also unto my beloved wife one third part of my moiety of the Mill owned by James Mitchell and myself erected across the Beaver pond Creek during her Widowhood.

Item 2<sup>nd</sup> I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Jemima Fox one feather bed and furniture, one horse, two Cows & Calves and one deer, all of first choice, also an equal proportion of my negroes with my children Maria, Sebastian, Theresa, and Mary Anna Fox, to her & her heirs forever.

Item 3<sup>rd</sup> I give and bequeath to my son Sebastian Fox all my land lying in Northampton County. Also my moiety of the mill erected across the Beaver pond Creek which is attached to said land and the timber belonging to me in James Mitchell's land grounds on said Creek together with two years schooling at such school as his guardian shall think proper to send him to which shall be paid out of my estate.

Item 4<sup>th</sup> I give and bequeath to my daughter Luitilda Fox Dampson one bed and furniture and ten dollars in cash to her and her heirs forever.
