Bryan of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being in a feeble State of Health but of a well disposing mind & both of perfect sense and memory make this my last Will and Testament in the following manner & form (Viz) I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother John Bryan a son of my late sister Mildred which sister is now the wife of John the said Brother John Bryan occasioned by the division of property the together with the balance of my Lands that are not heretofore given away to him and his heirs forever.

And the following should have been first inserted (Viz) I give and bequeath to my beloved Brother Robert Bryan a son of my late sister Mildred all my said Brother's Land this to him and his heirs forever.

The above Substant and above to be my last Will and Testament and furthermore I constitute and Ordain my Brother John Bryan to be my Executor In Witness whereof I have hereunto

In the name of God Amen I James Hill of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being in perfect sense and memory and knowing that it is appointed me to die do make and Ordain this my last Will & Testament that I give my Land to the Lord and my Body to be buried there I leave my loving Wife Mary Hill all my Lines during her Natural Life on Widowhood and — provision for the ensuing year and one shilling and both thereof I give them to my living son James Hill and if he should die on Mary before he should come of age to set for himself not for them to be lived out but to be settled upon the land and wherever they should be given for him to see to them, also I give him my farming tract of Land also I give my living daughter Mary Ann Hill my home plantation and a certain tract of Land and the same under of my property to be sold and after paying my last debts to be divided between said Mary Ann Hill and said James Hill as settling my Land and Seal this 10th day of September 1819. Thus Witness my Executors.
