

Elizabeth the following lines wherein I now live bounded as follows (to wit) Beginning at the mouth of the ready Branch then up the said Branch to the Head, then with my own Boundary to Matthew Johnsons Corner black Iron Standing in the Horse Branch from thence a straight line to a large oak Standing on the road side near my black Smiths Shop from thence nearly a north course to the Head of a branch that runs up near the Road then down the said branch to the ordinary Branch down that to the old mill pond side then up the side of pond to the first plantation during her Natural life - Item. I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth

Olson Negroes known by the following names, Dick, Phoebe, Honour, Eady, Sherry, Jacob, Allen, Charity, Mary, Mary, & Jack to her & her heirs forever - Item. My will and desire is that the plantation I bought of Matt Johnson should remain in the possession of my Executors also eight Negroes known by the following names, Samuel, Sampson, Luke, Young Father, Ridley, Lucy, Harshas, daughter of Luke, Rachel & Betsy, the said Negroes to be worked on said plantation for the special purpose of maintaining my daughter Betsy M. Newsum and her family also all the stock, crops, household and kitchen furniture, plantation utensils to remain on said plantation for the purpose of carrying on the business, but in case her present Husband Willis Newsum should die in her life time, then my will is that my Executors put her in full possession of all the property I have left in their possession for maintenance & a right inheritance to her and her heirs forever, but in case my daughter Betsy M. Newsum should die in the life time of her present Husband Willis Newsum, then I give the land and plantation whereon she now lives to her equally divided between my two grandsons James Olson and Thomas Newsum to them and each of them and their heirs forever, also my will is that all the personal estate remaining on the plantation aforementioned should be equally divided between my daughter Betsy M. Newsum & children then alive, in case of her death, these & their heirs to them and each of them and their heirs forever.

227 Item. I give unto my son Orono Hall the remaining part of the tract of Land wherein I now live as I have not lent to my wife with all the improvements black smith tools, machinery &c to him and his heirs forever - Item. I give unto my son Orono the following land lying on the by-pass Swamp bounded as follows Beginning at the mouth of the great Branch down the swamp to the Beaver dam Swamp then up the Beaver Run to the mouth of the pine branch then up the pine branch to a corner to be made, then a straight line to a corner line leaving about two hundred yards of the wood Land to the blackwell plantation all the way then with a curved line to the great Branch then down said branch to the first Station to him and his heirs forever -

Item I give unto my son Orono Station Negroes known by the following names, John, Lucy, Ted, Harshas, Harshas Son, Wade, Betsy, Sarah, Elizabeth, Stephen, Saml, Willis, old Jimmy, and Seneca, & Anthony to him and his heirs forever - Item. I give unto my son Henry all the remaining part of my land that lies over the Beaver dam Swamp that I have not given to my son Orono to him and his heirs forever - Item. I give unto my son Henry Olson Negroes known by the following names, Samuel, Ambrose, Hall, Peter, Lottise, Solomon, David, Mary daughter of Lottise, Adam, Percily, Oph, and old Father, to him and his heirs forever - Item. I give unto my daughter Martha Maria ten Negroes known by the following names, Phoebe, Simon, Lewis, Carter, Sam, Mary, Esther, Abby, Selby and I leave to her and her heirs forever - Item. I give unto my grand daughter Harriett Anderson one Negro boy named David son of Father to her & her heirs forever - Item. I give unto my daughter Betsy M. Newsum next child that should be born after the date of this my will, one Negro girl by the name of Angelina to her and her heirs forever - Item. I give unto my grandson James O. Newsum one Negro boy by the name of Doctor to him and his heirs forever - Item. I give unto my grandson Thomas O. Holloman one Negro boy by the name of Laurence to him and his heirs forever - Item. My will and desire is that all the personal estate

Of my Negroes that should come after the date of this my Will should go with their clothes as they are devised to each of them and their heirs forever. Item I give unto my beloved wife Elizabeth my ffig, and thence three work horses, four cows and calves four pigs, two feather beds and furniture, my shoes, and all my other household ware, and fifty barrels of corn and two thousand weights of pork to her and her heirs forever. Item I send unto my beloved wife Elizabeth over black and lock hair two tables two chairs dressing her natural life, and after her death I give the black and lock hair and tables to my daughter Martha Maria; to her and her heirs forever. Item I give unto my son James three horses say black red blooded & bay mare, four cows & calves four pigs and two feather beds & furniture, two tables one clock fifty barrels of corn and two thousand weights of pork, and after the death of my wife I give him the chairs black hair to him and his heirs forever. Item I give unto my daughter Martha Maria two feather beds and furniture to her and her heirs forever.

My Will and Desire is after the death of my wife that the said land her should be equally divided the number of shares and the part the houses is and I give to my son Henry to him and his heirs forever. Item I give the other parts of my land after the death of my wife to my daughter Martha Maria to her & her heirs forever.

Item I desire is six Negroes that I have not given away, if any will can be discharged without selling of them, though my will is that they be divided as I shall hereafter direct. Item my will & desire is that all my estate that I have not given away or lent should be sold by my Executors & attorney arising to

discharge all my last debts and after all paid, if any remaining with the six Negroes above named to be equally divided between my wife Elizabeth and my following children, Thomas D. Evans, Henry & Martha Maria Hollamons to them and each of them & their heirs forever. And I do hereby nominate and appoint my dear son Thomas D. & Emma Hollamons my sole and sole Executors of this my last Will and testament discharging all other this to be my Will whereby I shall hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of June 1808 & twenty.

This last Will & testament of Emma Hollamons last was exhibited in open Court and duly proved in the following manner (Viz) The whole of the said Will and the signature thereof proved to be in the hand writing of the testator, by John P. R. Collins M. D. James, Allen Holway and John White. The said will was found in the testator's desk among his valuable papers & effects proved by the Oaths of David Stewart & Joseph P. Rogers, whereupon Emma Hollamons last one of the Executors in said Will named was qualified as the law directs, to be certified and Recorded.

I Jonathan Roberts of Northampton County & State of North Carolina, being of the State of North, but in my right mind and memory, do make and declare this my last Will and testament, this 27th day of July 1808 that I do hereby give and bequeath in manner and form following (Viz) I give and bequeath to my wife Mary Roberts the plantation whereon I now live with all the appurtenances, and one thousand acres, and all my stock of cattle, sheep, and hogs, together with all my plantation tools, two feather beds and furniture, two tables, & two chairs, *Emma* her natural life, and after her
