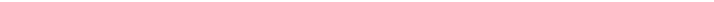

 mind & memory do hereby certify as this 15th day of April in the year of our
 Lord one thousand Eight Hundred & twenty six make & publish this my
 last will and testament in manner following that is to say first I give &
 bequeath unto my dearly beloved daughter Elizabeth the sum
 of five Shillings also give & bequeath unto my son Jonathan Piers the
 sum of five Shillings to him and his heirs and assigns also give &
 bequeath unto my son John Piers the sum of five Shillings to him and
 his heirs & assigns forever. Also give and bequeath unto my daughter
 Hannah Piers the sum of five shillings also give and bequeath unto my son
 John Piers one bay horse best build and black to him and his heirs and assigns forever all my
 daughter Mary Piers one cow and furniture & one pig and assigns forever. Also give and bequeath unto
 Piers one bed and furniture & one chest to E. Piers one cow and furniture and one chest to him his heirs
 also give and bequeath unto my son James Piers one chest of furniture also my
 that I leave him to him & his heirs and assigns is that my son John Piers should give my
 of fifty dollars in part of what he is owing my son if my son John Piers has any objection to giving
 sixty dollars above the value my will is that my son have five acres of my land & also give and bequeath unto my
 son John Piers one half of my land & also one bed furniture and
 cow to him and his heirs and assigns

bequeath unto my dear beloved wife Elizabeth Piers all the residue of
 my parishable estate that is except what I have already willed away
 both in word and act during her natural life by paying her
 fifteen pety dollars that I have already willed her also my will is
 that my wife Elizabeth Piers should have the years & months of the
 other half of house that I have not before willed away & also the house
 that willed away to my son John Piers that my wife Elizabeth
 Piers have the liberty of getting married, widows & bond & lightwood
 for her own years during her natural life & after her decease my will
 and desire is that my son Elizabeth Piers, when Mary says to
 that Piers should have this same half of land that I have willed
 to them their heirs & assigns forever. And I hereby ordain my
 dearly beloved wife Elizabeth Piers executrix of this my last will
 and testament in all things whereof I the said Elisha Piers last to
 this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day
 and year above written Signed Sealed published & declared
 by the said Elisha Piers the testator as his last will & testament
 in the presence of us who is in the presence of each other at the
 time of signing & sealing thereof—
