Now give unto my son Edmund Riches three negroes (female) Henry, Sarah & William. Now give unto my son David Riches three negroes (female) Elizabeth and Sarah. Now give unto my son Abraham Riches his negroes Mary, Daniel and one beautiful and large bay horse. Now give my lands to be equally divided amongst my son and (brother) William, Isaac, Edwin Moses, and Abraham Riches.

Now I leave the balance of my ^{half the} cattle, sheep and pigs, house hold and kitchen furniture and plantation intended to be sold for the purpose of discharging my last debts. Now give my wife twenty barrels of corn and five hundred pounds of pork.

Now the residue of my estate give to be equally divided amongst my five sons to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I appoint my friend, John A. Gage my executor to this my last will and testament to discharge the same by me made, signed, sealed and attested this 22nd day of October 1826.

Pugh the whole of the negroes that I acquired in marriage with her together with her the carriage, dress, jewelry and money, the latter of whom I purchased of William Pugh, with the present and future increase of the said female to her, her heirs and assigns forever. Now give and devise to my wife, aforesaid, Mary A. Pugh, all the lands I purchased of General Allen Jones, Russell Pugh and John Pugh, lying in the County of Northampton in the State aforesaid, upon the most full and tract of land, which belongs in part to my said wife, her heirs and assigns forever. Now give bequeath and devise to my said wife Mary Allen Pugh, the one half of all my stock of horses, cattle, pigs and sheep, and every other kind of stock, of which I may see fit to keep, including such horses as I may at the time of my death have and use as carriage horses, with my carriage or such carriage and may own and my said wife may use, at the time of my death together with the whole of my house hold and kitchen furniture, (except such articles as may hereafter be differently disposed of) to her, my said wife, her heirs and assigns forever.
