

George W. Jenkins's Will.

In the name of God, Amen, I George Washington Jenkins of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being of sound and perfect mind do make and declare this to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say,

1st. I give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas W. Jenkins the following negroes (viz) Ben, Bob, Grandion, Agnes, Phillip and Spencer to him and his heirs forever.

2nd. I give and bequeath unto my nephew George W. Jenkins Amy and her three youngest children with her future increase, to him and his heirs forever.

3rd. I do give and bequeath unto my brother Thomas W. Jenkins all bonds which are now due me for the hire of my negroes and which may here after become due, likewise my riding mare bridle and saddle to him and his heirs forever.

And I hereby make and ordain my brother Thomas W. Jenkins executors of this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said George Washington Jenkins have to this my last Will and Testament, set my hand and seal, this twenty-first day of January eighteen hundred and thirteen.

Signed sealed published & declared by George W. Jenkins the said George Washington Jenkins the Testator as his last Will and Testament in the presence of Parwell Vaughan & Mrs. who were present at the time of signing and sealing thereof. John + Woodroof his mark.

Northampton County St. June Court 1813. This last Will and Testament of George Washington Jenkins decd was exhibited in open Court and proved by the oaths of Parwell Vaughan and John Woodroof subscribing witnesses to the same, whereupon Thomas W. Jenkins the executor in first will named was duly qualified - Ordered to be certified and recorded.

In the name of God, Amen, I Joshua Vincent of Northampton County State of North Carolina being in perfect health of body and of sound mind and memory calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament viz: First of all I recommend my soul into the hands of its creator who gave it to me and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again.

I give unto my wife Lucy Vincent the following negroes, to wit, great Frank Jemmy his wife, Jude and Nelson to her forever. I give unto my two sons James Vincent & Michael Vincent the following negroes to wit Aaron, Solomon, Hall, Jeffry, quart David, little David, Willie, Shadrack, Nathan, Ted, Moses, Dick, Fanny, little Anna, Ned and Sue they and their increase to them and their forever, and the rest of my personal property I give unto my fair daughters Sally Jones, Polly Allen, Rebecca Sill and Parilla Noy to share and share equally all he - I lend unto my wife Lucy Vincent P^trs root of land I now reside on of Northampton County during her natural life and no worth horses & four head of cattle and all the household and furniture, and after her decease I give the said tract of land & stock household & furniture to my two sons James Vincent and Michael Vincent forever, in my will and desire that the rest of my stock should be sold and the money be equally divided between my two sons James Vincent & Michael Vincent after paying all my just debts that come against my estate - It is my will and desire that Charles Harrison should act as executor upon my estate, as attorney my hand & seal this 17 day of September 1811 -
