In the name of God Amen I Sophie Collier of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory blessed be God do this first day of February in the year of our Lord 1814 do make and publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following that is to say -

Iam. I stand with my beloved wife Mary Collier all my property both real and personal during her natural life & after her death it is my will and desire that Elizabeth Collier should have one bed of furniture and one years schooling to her and her heirs forever.

Iam. It is my will & desire that after the death of my wife all the property that I have left her except the bed of furniture given to Elizabeth Collier should be equally divided between my three sons Joseph and Bel & Thomas and their posterity forever -

Iam. It is my will and desire that my son Joseph Collier should pay unto my son Joseph seven dollars out of the property I have given him also it is my will and desire that my son Bel Collier should pay to my son Joseph Collier two dollars as I have given them to that account more than Joseph. And I hereby make and declare my beloved wife Mary Collier execatrix of this my last and Testament in witness whereof I the said Sophie Collier have to this my last Will and Testament at my hand & seal the day & year above written -

James Hobson's Will. In the name of Almighty God Amen I James Hobson of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina deeply impressed with the thoughts of the uncertainty of life have made this my last Will and Testament. I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Maria Hobson one office and one riding chair to her heirs and

and furnished and one negro girl Eliza to her and her heirs forever. Also to my beloved daughter Mary Hobson one feather bed of furniture and eight dollars to her and her heirs forever. I leave to my beloved son James Hobson one feather bed of furniture one filling saddle and saddle and one cat. I give to my beloved son Thomas Hobson one negro man Caesar to him & his heirs forever. It is my desire that the said negro Caesar may be valued at three hundred dollars and then for my wife Maria, my daughter Mary Scarborough my daughter Eliza and my son James each of them to draw out of my estate in proportion to the valuation of said negro Caesar. It is my desire after all my just debts be paid that the residue of my estate real and personal may be sold & equally divided between my dear wife and all my children. The legacy I leave my son James it is my desire that my son Thomas may take it in his hands and dispose of it as he sees fit, and if he should die without an heir begotten by his body that the said legacy may go to my son Thomas and I do appoint my friend Jacob Liles and Elijah Scarborough my executors to this my last Will & Testament I do revoke & cancel all Wills by me hitherto made and so by these presents acknowledge this my last Will and Testament written with my own hand and signed this 28th of January one thousand eight hundred & eighteen -

Winborn Jenkins's Will. In the name of God Amen I Winborn Jenkins of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same do this 25th day of February in the year 1814 make and publish this my last Will & Testament in manner following, my I stand with my beloved wife Susanna holding the land and plantation wherein I now live known by the name of the Old Man's Plantation and five negroes with Amy, George, Peter, Levi, and Lazarus during her natural life and after her death the four negroes as above named to be equally divided among all my children to them and their heirs forever. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Dutell wife of Daniel

David Tuttle one hundred & thirty six acres of land known by the tract formerly owned by Henry Dutell and five negroes wif. David, Alice, Peter, Green and Henry one bed of furniture one chest his cows & calves to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Jenkins and Polly Jenkins all that tract of land lying on Caithers Swamp known by the tract that I purchased of Lawrence Dickinson and the balance was given by my father — Wilson Jenkins died to be equally divided between them and their heirs forever. — Item. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Jenkins five negroes wif. Lucy, C. S. Daniel, cattle & Easter two cows and calves one bed of furniture & one chest to her & her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Jenkins five negroes to wif. Steven, Jerry, Lucy, Cole & Phillips one bed of furniture one Chest & his cows & calves to her & her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Jenkins all that tract of land known by Underwood tract, also all that tract of land that I purchased of Peter Tuttle together with the cattle & seat and all thereunto belonging also after the death of my beloved wife Susanna Jenkins all that tract of land & plantation wherupon I now live with all the lands adjoining that I have purchased to it to him this heirs forever. — Item. also I give & bequeath unto my son Charles Jenkins — seven negroes wif. Bessie, Vinah, Venus, Beck, Admon, Isaac & Abram, one bed of furniture one chest and his cows & calves to him and his heirs forever. — Item. I give & bequeath unto my daughter Millie Jenkins one hundred & eighty four acres of land known by the name of Dean tract and the following negroes wif. Hannah, Mr. Jack, Trip, Cherry, Duke, big Lucy, one bed of furniture, 1 chest, 2 Cows & calves to her & her heirs forever — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Tuttle wife of David Tuttle one negro by the name of Sam, to her & her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Jenkins one negro by the name of Little Lucy to her & her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary — Jenkins one negro by the name of Rachel to her and her heirs forever. — Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Abby Jenkins four hundred dollars to be raised out of my estate to her & her heirs forever.

Item. my will and desire is that all the remaining part of my estate of any kind whatsoever that will be left after paying my just debts and for settling my estate should remain in the hands of my beloved wife Susanna Jenkins as a loan during her natural life and after her death to be equally divided among all my children, to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I nominate and appoint David Tuttle and Henry D. Jenkins executors to this my last Will & Testament, disannulling all other writings by me made —
