

Sealey Parker's Will. Now in the name of Almighty God Amen Sealey Parker of Northampton County and State of N. Carolina son now very sick and weak of body but am possessed of sound & disposing mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God. therefore calling to mind that it is appointed for all people once to die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in the following form and manner, to wit, I give and bequeath to my only child and son Armitstead one half of the estate and amount of all my goods and chattels after being sold severally and individually. - I then, I give and bequeath to my sister Chorke Griggard fifty dollars of the second half to have and to hold forever. - I then, I give and bequeath to my brother Hulon Griggard all the balance of the second half (after all my just debts are fully paid) and sister Chorke Griggard receives her fifty dollars) to him & his heirs forever. - I then, I do appoint and will that Hulon Griggard be guardian for my son Armitstead believing that he is not capable of being his own guardian. - I do nominate and appoint Hulon Griggard my whole and sole executor in my last Will revoking all other Wills heretofore by me made. Witness whereof I have affixed my seal this 17<sup>th</sup> day of September Anno Domini 1815 - Sealey Parker (Seal)

This last Will and Testament of Sealey Parker deceased was proved in open Court by the oath of Nicholas Turner a subscribing witness thereto, whereupon Hulon Griggard the executor therein named was qualified, & legally to Law, ordered to be certified and recorded.

Green Lassiter's Will. In the name of God Amen I Green Lassiter of Northampton County and State of North Carolina being at this time very weak in body but of a sound mind and memory thanks be to God for it therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all flesh once to die, as for all the worldly goods as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me, I give in the following manner and form, I then it is my will and desire that my just debts and funeral charges be paid by my executors hereafter named. I then I and my loving wife Annella Lassiter the use of the Land and plantation whereon I now live during her natural life or widowhood and after her death or marriage. I give and bequeath said land and plantation to my two sons Reddock & William Lassiter to be equally divided between them share and share alike, to them and their heirs forever. - I then I have all the rest of my property of every kind in the case of my said wife to raise my children on, and after they all arrive to lawful age to be equally divided amongst my seven daughters (viz) Elizabeth, Parthena, Martha, Delila, Mary, Mildred, & Lucilla Lassiter to them and their heirs forever. - I nominate and appoint Eliot Trustall to this my last Will and Testament, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 31<sup>st</sup> day of October 1815 -
