

James Lamberston senior's Will. In the name of God Amour I James Lamberston senior of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being in my perfect senses do make & ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following to wit. First I lend unto my beloved wife Esther Lamberston during her widowhood all the property of which I may die possessed (except so much as shall be sufficient for the payment of my lawful debts) and such legacies as shall be hereafter named in consideration of her maintaining my children, and giving to each of them two years schooling so soon as they shall respectively arrive at the age of ten years; so as not to be a charge to the children. — Secondly. It is my will and desire that at the death or marriage of my wife Esther the plantation I purchased of J. Burgess belong to my son Allen More Lamberston to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto the child with which my wife is now pregnant (after her death or widowhood) the tract of land wherein I now live, to said child its heirs & assigns forever. Fourthly. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eliza Ann Lamberston one negro girl named Lucy and one negro boy named Tom, to her and her heirs forever. — Fifthly. It is my will and desire that after the death or marriage of my wife Esther, all the rest of my property not herein before named

the child with which my wife is now pregnant & Eliza Ann Lamberston; and if either of the before named children should die before they arrive at years of maturity, it is my will and desire that its proportion be equally divided between the survivors and survivors of the said children. — Sixthly. I give and bequeath unto my sons Daniel, James and John Lamberston, and son in law John Burgess, my granddaughter Eliza Burgess and my daughter Eliza Harris, the sum of five shillings each, to them and their heirs forever. —

Lastly, I nominate and appoint my friend Joseph Price my sole executor to this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have subscribed my name and affixed my seal this 8th day of November 1814

William Cox's Will. In the name of God Amour I William Cox of the County of Northampton and State of North Carolina being weak of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory do constitute make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, I give and dispose of my estate in manner and form following. I lend unto Martha Briggs ten acres of land wherein she now lives until the death of my wife Rebecca Cox. I lend unto my loving wife Rebecca Cox during her life all the balance of my land and after her death my will and desire is that all my land be sold and the money equally divided between Mary Briggs, Isid. Benjamin, John and Lucy W. Cox to them & their heirs but if Mary Briggs or Lucy Cox should die leaving no child then in that case my will and desire is that their share of money be equally divided between my three sons Isid. Benjamin and Lucy Cox to

Elizabeth Cox one feather bed & one box to her and her heirs forever. I give unto John Cox twenty five dollars to him & his heirs forever. My will and desire is that as soon as convenient after my death my executors sell all the balance of my estate pay off all my just debts & funeral expences and the balance of money I give and bequeath to Mary Briggs, Isid. Benjamin, John & Lucy W. Cox to them & their heirs forever. Lastly I nominate & appoint my friend John Thompson my sole executor to this my last Will and Testament.
