

Adam Twenty dollars, one shilling. Northely, I gave to John Martin
 children fifteen dollars a piece. Southely I gave to my daughter
 Rhoda Martin one negro girl named Letitia and one boy named
 Isaac two other beds and furniture. Twelvethly, I gave my
 son Charles Martin twelve dollars, and also Eighty dollars that
 I have lent him before, and also the land where our house lies
 The balance of the stock left for the use of the plantation.
 I likewise constitute, make and ordain James Martin and
 Jacobus Martin the sole executors of this my last Will and
 Testament. And I do hereby utterly disavow and disown all and
 every other former testaments, wills and legacies, by me in anywise
 before named. Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my
 last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have here
 unto set my hand and seal this eighth day of August in the
 year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty two.

This Will of Etheldred Martin dec. was offered for probate, & approved by the Justs of Matthew M. Martin & all cog Martin the subscribing witnesses thereto, and a faciat being entered to the probate thereof by Henry Nelson Etheldred Martin and Henry Nelson, Guardians for the children namely; Mary Nelson, Christopher Nelson and Henry Nelson. The issue of said will not now, was ordered to be made up by the Justs another following day (to wit) Leathur Edwards, John Lamberton, John Hancock, John Cook, Benjamin Snow, James Fisher, James Houghton, the said Long, Rhodes, Babb, Eunice Babb, John Houghton and Joseph M. Hays, being sworn and impanelled, to try the issue joined between the parties for their faith as say, the paper writing exhibited is the last will and Testament of Etheldred Martin dec. therefore it is the sense of the Court that the said will be received. Whereupon James Martin and Joshua Martin the Executors in said will named, was granted as the Law directs.

 her issue. I also give and bequeath unto my said wife my gray horse
 and gray colt, twenty five barrels of corn, two thousand pounds for the Old
 Bond and Debt, five acres and halves, five acres & five, two last of ground
 & my five & Hannah, to her & her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my son William Maughon all the balance of my Estate both Real &
 Personal to him and his heirs forever. It is nevertheless subject to the following
 provisions Viz. Provided my said son William should die unmarried
 or in case he should Marry & die without lawful issue then & in that
 case it is my will and desire that my son Thomas Maughon (now
 a Resident in the State of Georgia) and his lawful heirs should
 have & inherit all and singular the above named property given
 to my said son William — Saidly, I do now nominate and
 appoint my son Cephaiah Maughon & Richard H. Brown, my
 Executors to this my last will & Testament. Signed sealed and
